What is a Derbyshire Wayfarer?

One ticket that lets you make as many bus and train trips throughout Derbyshire on a single day.

You make a one-off payment and scratch off the date on the ticket when you want to travel. Then hop aboard the bus at any time or the train after 9.00am. You can also use your Derbyshire Wayfarer to make some trips to and from some places outside the county as long as the journey starts or finishes in Derbyshire, including Burton upon Trent, Leek, Macclesfield, Sheffield and Uttoxeter. How much is a Derbyshire Wayfarer?

They're great value for money – so make the most of your Derbyshire Wayfarer by traveling far and wide!

- ▶ £5.25 concessionary for any senior citizen, child*, or Gold Card holder
- ▶ £10.50 adult plus one child*
- ▶ £18.90 group for two adults and up to three children*

* A child is aged between five and 15 inclusive. In addition, up to two children under five can travel for free with each adult ticket holder. You will need to prove that you qualify for a concessionary ticket. A dog may travel in the place of a child.

Where can I buy a Derbyshire Wayfarer?

You can get a Derbyshire Wayfarer on the day you want to travel or in advance. To make it valid remember to scratch off the date you want to travel.

On the day of travel

- ▶ **from the driver of these buses:** Arriva Midlands, Bowers Coaches, Doyles, Hulleys of Baslow, Midland Classic, Stagecoach in Chesterfield, TM Travel, Trent Barton and Yourbus.
- ▶ **at these railway stations:** Alfreton, Burton upon Trent, Buxton, Chesterfield, Derby, Long Eaton, New Mills Central,* New Mills Newtown* and Sheffield.

*These booking offices are only open until 1.00pm Monday-Friday. Please note that tickets cannot be bought on trains or at unstaffed stations.



In advance:

- ▶ **from bus company travel offices** at Chesterfield Coach Station, Derby Bus Station, Macclesfield bus station and Sheffield Interchange and Transport Executive Travel Centres.
- ▶ **from Tourist Information Centres** in Ashbourne, Bakewell, Buxton, Castleton, Chesterfield, Derby, Edale, Hayfield, Leek, Matlock and Swadlincote, New Mills Heritage Centre and East Staffordshire Borough Council's Customer Service Centres in Burton upon Trent and Uttoxeter.
- ▶ **at libraries** in Alfreton, Belper, Heanor, Ilkeston, Long Eaton, Melbourne and Swadlincote.
- ▶ **by telephone** from Derbyshire County Council on 01629 536738. Please have your credit/debit card details (MasterCard or Visa only) when you call.

Using your Derbyshire Wayfarer on buses

You can use your Derbyshire Wayfarer for travel within Derbyshire on all the services operated by the companies listed below, any time and any day of the week. You can also make journeys just over the border between Derbyshire, Burton upon Trent, Leek, Macclesfield, Sheffield city centre and Uttoxeter on bus services run by these operators:

Arriva Midlands, Bowers Coaches, Clowes, D & G, Doyles, Felix, First, Glovers, G & J Holmes, Huddersfield Bus, Hulley's of Baslow, Kinchbus, Littles, Midland Classic, Notts & Derby, Speedwellbus, Stagecoach, TM Travel, Trent Barton, Veolia, Warringtons, Yourbus.

Also on these branded services in Derbyshire:

Allestree, Amberline, Black Cat, Harlequin, Ilkeston Flyer, Indigo, Mickleover, Nines, One, Pronto, Rainbow, Red Arrow, Royal Derby, Sevens, Sixes, Spondon Flyer, Transpeak, Two and Villager.

Using your Derbyshire Wayfarer on the bus outside the county:

- ▶ within Staffordshire on services 42A, 442 and 443
- ▶ within Nottinghamshire on the Ilkeston to Sawley service 15
- ▶ between Derbyshire and East Midlands Airport on services Indigo and SKY (Skylink Derby/Leicester)
- ▶ between New Mills and Lyme Park on service 199 on Sundays
- ▶ between Derbyshire and Meadowhall on service 272
- ▶ between Glossop and Holmfirth on service 951.

Using your Derbyshire Wayfarer on trains

You can use your Derbyshire Wayfarer on Cross Country Trains, East Midlands Trains, Northern Trains and the TransPennine Express, between any of the stations on the following lines. Travel at any time on Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holiday Mondays and after 9.00am Monday to Friday.

Sheffield – Edale – New Mills Central
Sheffield – Alfreton – Langley Mill
Sheffield – Chesterfield – Derby
Shirebrook – Whitwell (Robin Hood Line)

Derby – Long Eaton
Derby – Tutbury and Hatton – Uttoxeter
Derby – Willington – Burton upon Trent

Close to 'shivering mountain' Mam Tor, the Blue John Cavern offers fine show caves and stalagmite formation amongst the rich Blue John stone.

Take a cable car for stunning views across the Derwent Valley gorge. At the summit discover two magnificent show caverns, nature trails, play areas and maze set in a 60 acre park.
