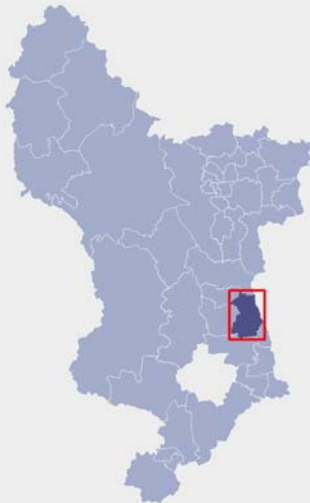


Community Profile

The Heanor/Codnor area lies to the east of Amber Valley district. It covers an area of 3,629 hectares. The eastern boundary borders the county of Nottinghamshire. The main centres of population in the area are the towns of Codnor and Loscoe.

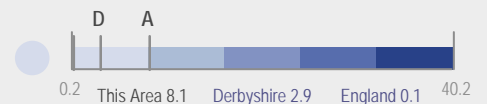

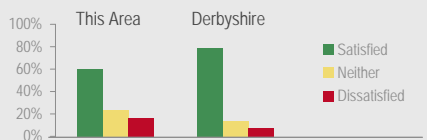

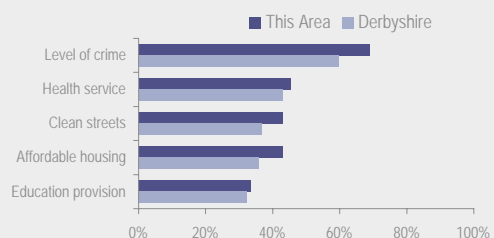

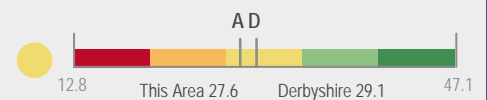


Satisfaction with opportunities for participating in local decision making 2006

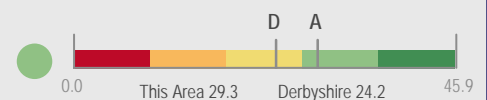

- discuss, with representatives from relevant bodies, environmental issues around waste disposal and gully cleaning;

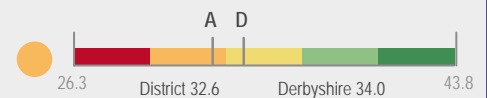

- participate in gathering evidence for the improvement of recycling in the area.

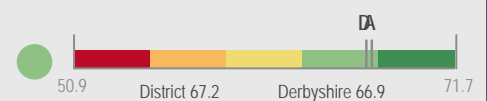

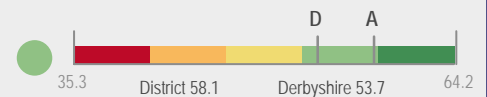
Residents who have formally volunteered in the last 3 years 2006

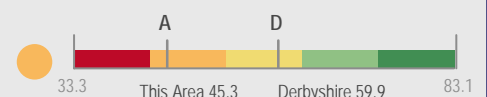
Residents who have informally volunteered for a relative in the last 3 years 2006

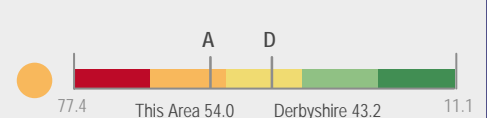
Residents who have informally volunteered for a non-relative in the last 3 years 2006

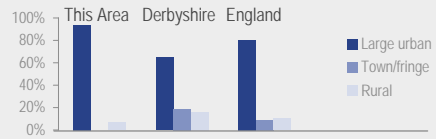
Residents who think people not treating each other with respect and consideration is a problem in their local area 2006

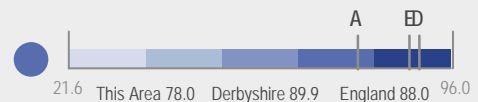


Percentage of people who think that "abandoned or burnt out cars" is a problem		2006

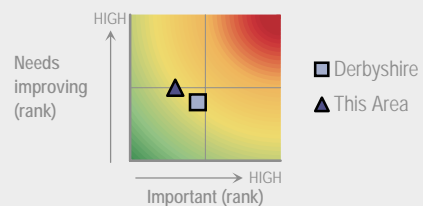

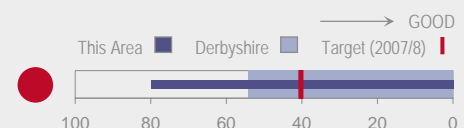


Residents' views on the frequency of: Vandalism and graffiti			2006

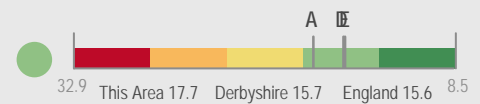
Low income populations: all 2004

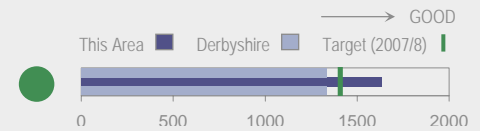


Low income populations: pensioners 2004

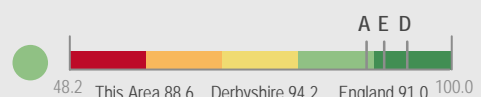
Level 2 at key stage 1 in writing

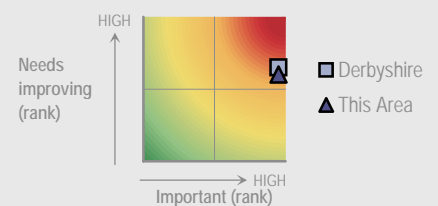


Asthma emergency admissions - under 19s 2005

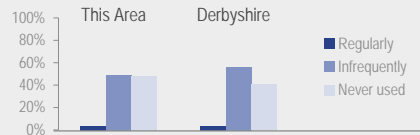

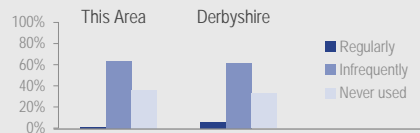

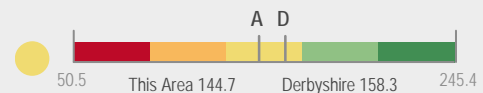


Residents' use of theatres and concert halls			2006

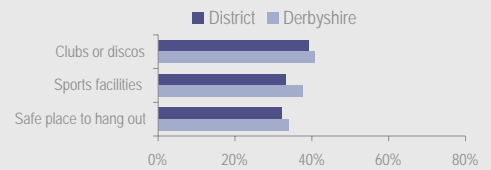
What young people most like doing

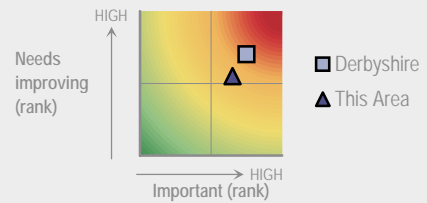

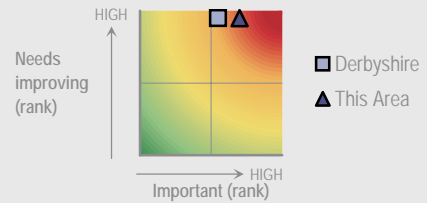

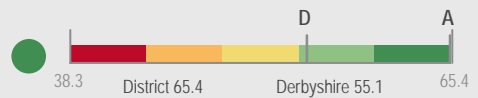

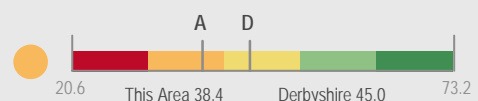
Residents who use the internet at home	2005
