

# Community Profile

The Shirebrook area lies to the south east of the Bolsover district. It covers an area of 2,455 hectares. The main centre of population is the town of Shirebrook. The area borders Nottinghamshire on its eastern boundary, are Clowne, Whitwell and Creswell..

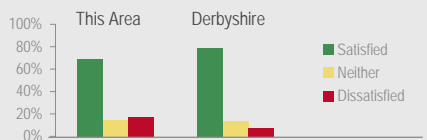
There are seven Lower Layer Super Output Areas in the Shirebrook Community Area ranked in the 20% most deprived in England. They are located in an area

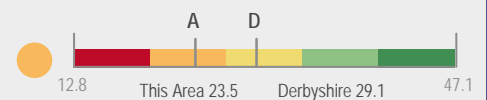


Satisfaction with opportunities for participating in local decision making 2006

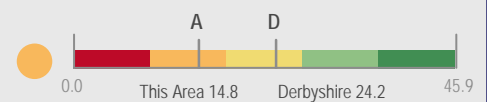

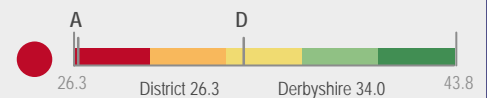
Bolsover Older People's Forum has approximately 100 members. Their primary objectives are to:

- provide information on pensions material on pensions material.

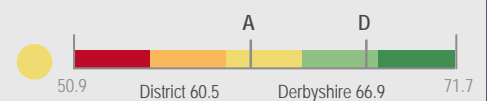

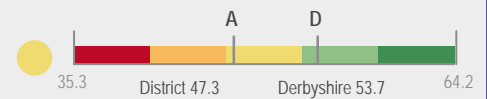

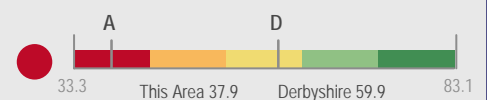
Residents who have informally volunteered for a relative in the last 3 years 2006

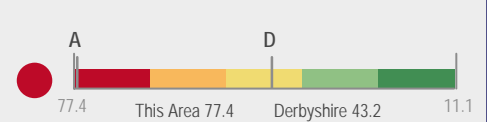
Residents who have informally volunteered for a non-relative in the last 3 years 2006

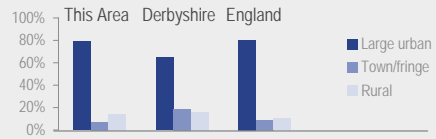
Residents who think people not treating each other with respect and consideration is a problem in their local area 2006

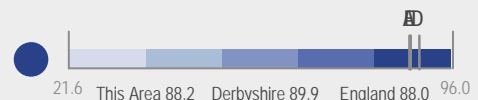


Percentage of people who think that "abandoned or burnt out cars" is a problem		2006

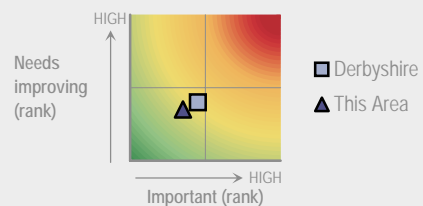

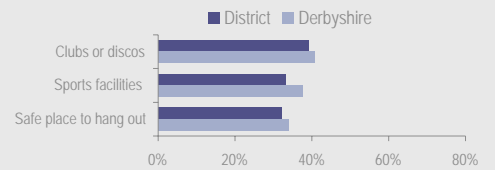

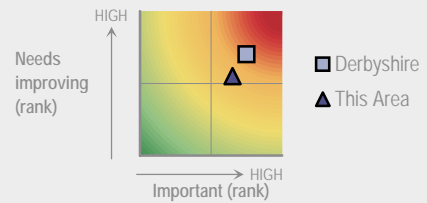

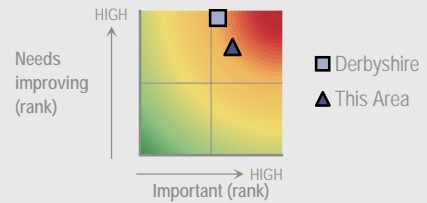

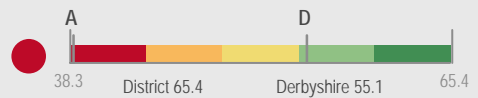

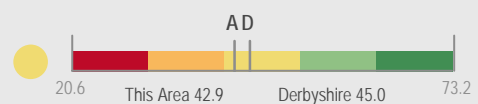
Residents who use the internet at home	2005
