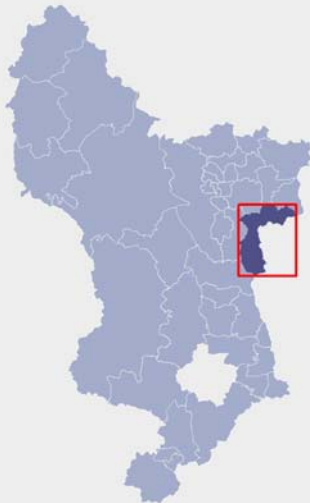


Community Profile



This area profile is the first stage in drawing together a range of information about a particular geographical area and its communities. The profile brings together basic statistical and consultation data and, where available, performance information and details about key initiatives in the area. There are 10 sections following the Audit Commission's quality of life themes. The profile aims to provide a more rounded picture of an area than can be achieved by viewing the information in isolation and should be used as a tool to provide a context and overview of an area, rather than detailed analysis of a particular topic or information type.



The South Normanton/Tibshelf area lies to the south of the Bolsover district. It covers an area of 5,795 hectares and borders the county of Nottinghamshire on its eastern boundary. The main centres of population are in the towns of South Normanton, Pinxton and Tibshelf. There are smaller settlements of population to the north of the area in the villages of Doe Lea, Stony Houghton, and New Houghton and Creswell..

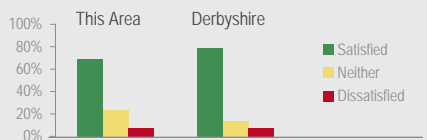

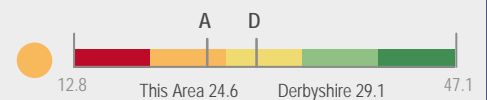


Satisfaction with opportunities for participating in local decision making 2006

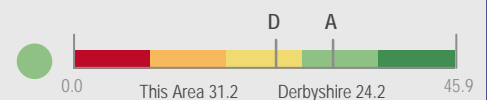

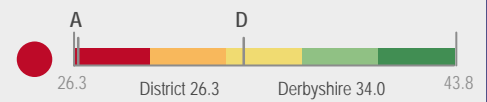
Bolsover Older People's Forum has approximately 100 members. Their primary objectives are to:

- provide information on pensions material.

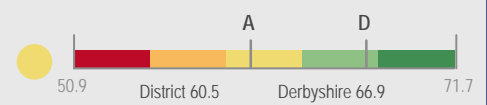

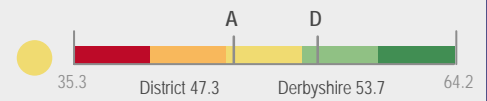
Residents who have formally volunteered in the last 3 years 2006

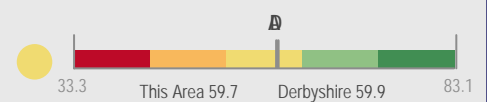
Residents who have informally volunteered for a relative in the last 3 years 2006

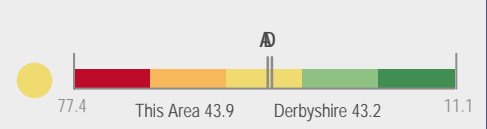
Residents who have informally volunteered for a non-relative in the last 3 years 2006

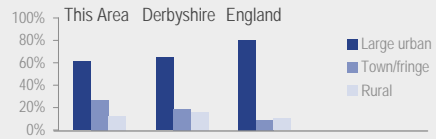
Residents who think people not treating each other with respect and consideration is a problem in their local area 2006

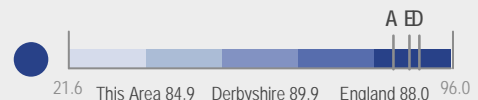

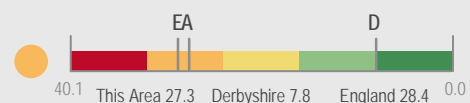

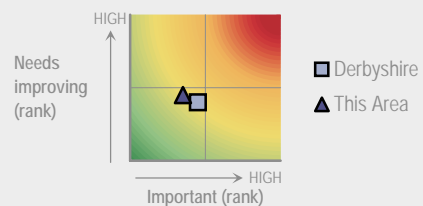


Air quality

A herb garden with containerised herb plants of 200 varieties on sale.

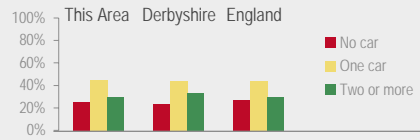

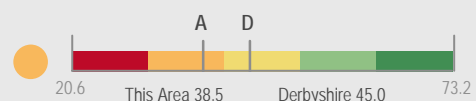
