

Community Profile



This area profile is the first stage in drawing together a range of information about a particular geographical area and its communities. The profile brings together basic statistical and consultation data and, where available, performance information and details about key initiatives in the area. There are 10 sections following the Audit Commission's quality of life themes. The profile aims to provide a more rounded picture of an area than can be achieved by viewing the information in isolation and should be used as a tool to provide a context and overview of an area, rather than detailed analysis of a particular topic or information type.



The Staveley area lies to the north east of the Chesterfield district. It covers an area of 1,793 hectares. The main centres of population lie to the south west of the area centred on the town of Staveley, comprising the settlements of Inkersall Green, Middlecroft, Poolsbrook and Netherthorpe. Smaller settlements are located at Woodthorpe and Mastin Moor, to the north east of the area.

Areas where there are very high levels of deprivation

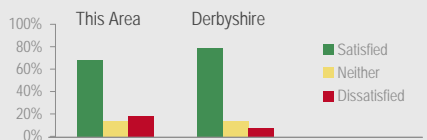
There are six Lower Layer Super Output Areas in the Staveley Community Area ranked in the 20% most deprived in England. They are adjacent to each other,

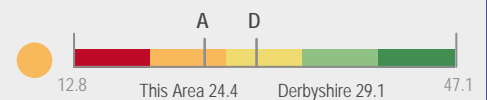


Satisfaction with opportunities for participating in local decision making 2006

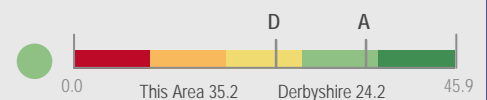

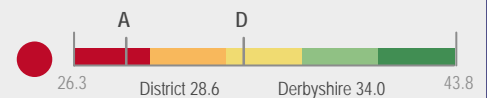
Staveley Seniors group has approximately 60 members. Their primary objectives are to:

- improve access of information through the use of the Gold Card magazine and other publications.

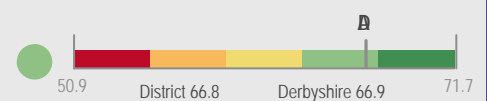

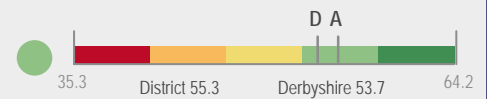
Residents who have formally volunteered in the last 3 years 2006

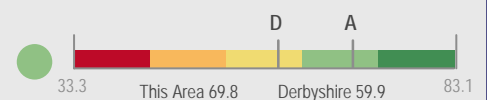
Residents who have informally volunteered for a relative in the last 3 years 2006

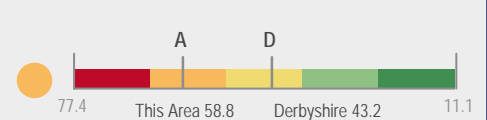
Residents who have informally volunteered for a non-relative in the last 3 years 2006

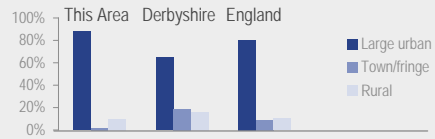
Residents who think people not treating each other with respect and consideration is a problem in their local area 2006

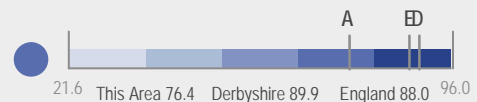

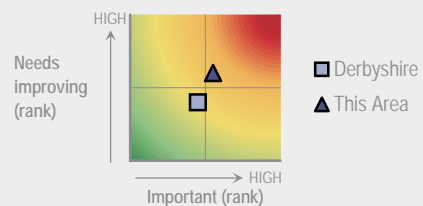

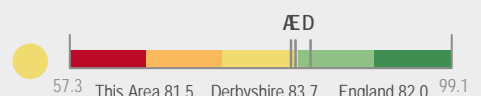
Level 2 at key stage 1 in reading

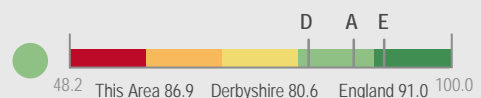
Level 2 at key stage 1 in writing

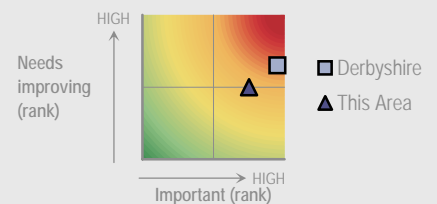


Asthma emergency admissions - under 19s 2005

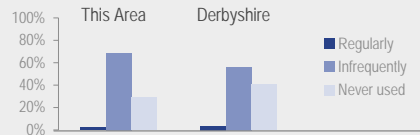

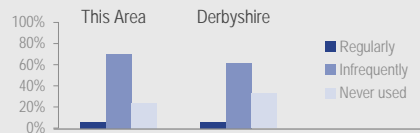

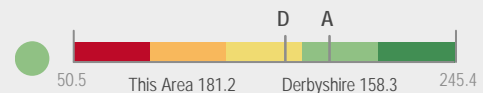


Residents' use of theatres and concert halls			2006

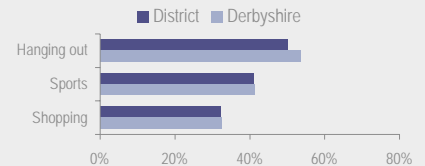

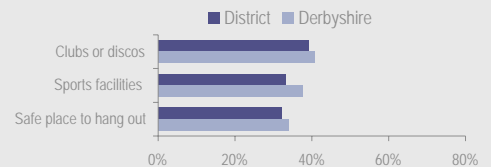
What young people most like doing

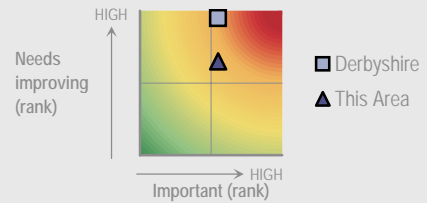
Residents' views on:- Level of traffic congestion			2006

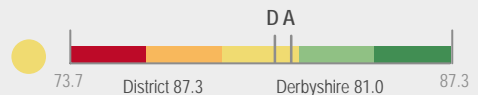


Residents' views on:- Road and pavement repairs			2006

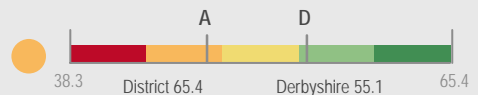

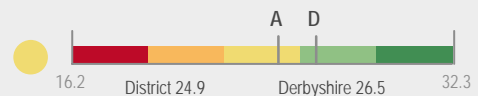
