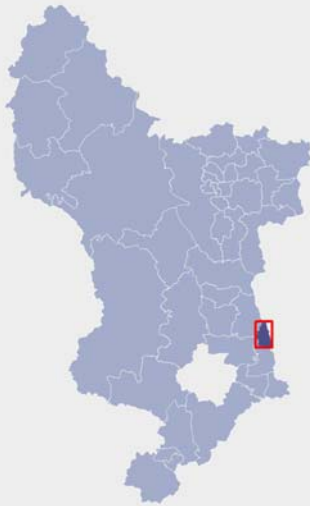


Community Profile



This area profile is the first stage in drawing together a range of information about a particular geographical area and its communities. The profile brings together basic statistical and consultation data and, where available, performance information and details about key initiatives in the area. There are 10 sections following the Audit Commission's quality of life themes. The profile aims to provide a more rounded picture of an area than can be achieved by viewing the information in isolation and should be used as a tool to provide a context and overview of an area, rather than detailed analysis of a particular topic or information type.



The Ilkeston area lies to the north east of the Erewash district of Derbyshire. It covers an area of 924 hectares. Population is centred on the town of Ilkeston and the suburbs of Cotmanhay, Shipley Common, Little Hallam, Gallows Inn, and Larklands.

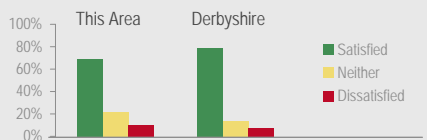
There are five Lower Layer Super Output Areas in the Ilkeston Community Area ranked in the 20% most deprived in England. They are located off the town

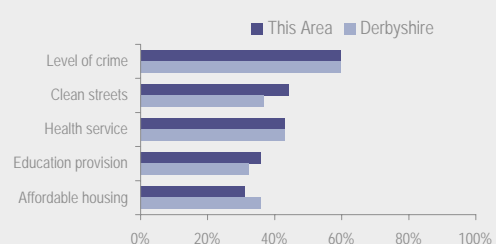

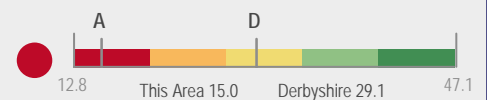


Satisfaction with opportunities for participating in local decision making 2006

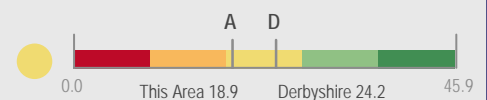

The Ilkeston and District 50+ Forum has approximately 98 members. The primary objectives of the Forum are to:

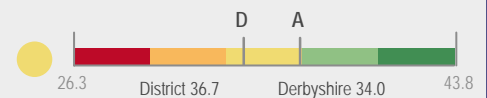
- promote initiatives designed to increase access to information for older people through the establishment of a local information line and the inclusion of information in Gold Card and other relevant publications;

- help improve pedestrian access to facilities in the area.

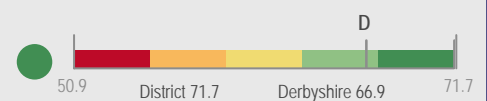

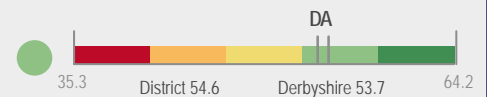
Residents who have formally volunteered in the last 3 years 2006

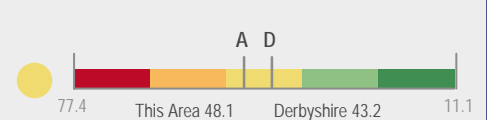
Residents who have informally volunteered for a non-relative in the last 3 years 2006

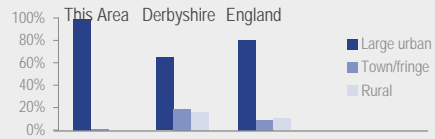
Residents who think people not treating each other with respect and consideration is a problem in their local area 2006

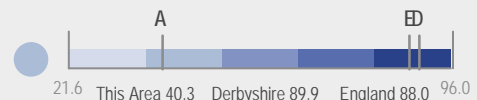


Percentage of people who think that "abandoned or burnt out cars" is a problem		2006

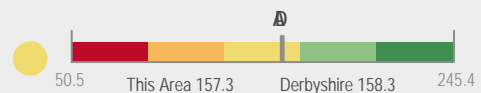


Residents' use of theatres and concert halls			2006

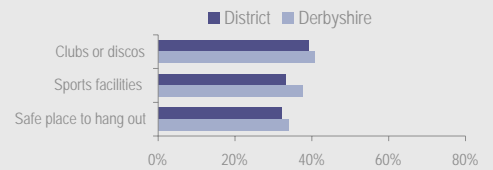
What young people most like doing

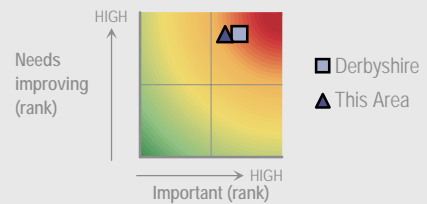
Residents use of local bus services			2006

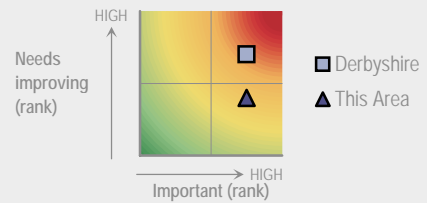

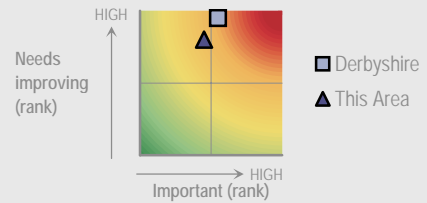
Residents' views on:- Level of traffic congestion			2006

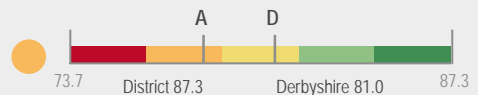


Residents' views on:- Road and pavement repairs			2006

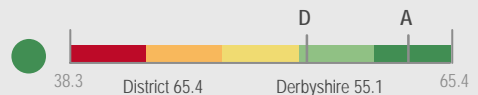

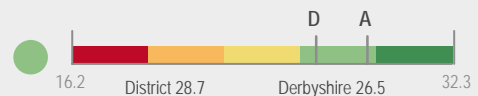

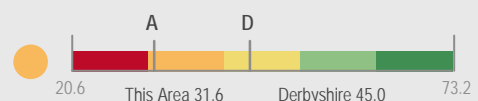
Residents who use the internet at home	2005
