

# Community Profile



This area profile is the first stage in drawing together a range of information about a particular geographical area and its communities. The profile brings together basic statistical and consultation data and, where available, performance information and details about key initiatives in the area. There are 10 sections following the Audit Commission's quality of life themes. The profile aims to provide a more rounded picture of an area than can be achieved by viewing the information in isolation and should be used as a tool to provide a context and overview of an area, rather than detailed analysis of a particular topic or information type.



The Long Eaton area lies to the south east of the Erewash district of Derbyshire. It covers an area of 1,517 hectares. The main centre of population is the town of Long Eaton and its hinterland covering the suburbs of Wilsthorpe, New Sawley and Sawley. The area is bordered by the county of Nottinghamshire on its eastern and southern boundaries.

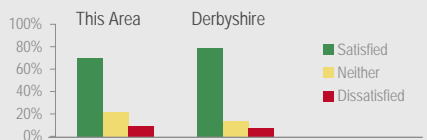
### Areas where there are very high levels of deprivation

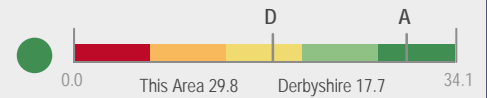

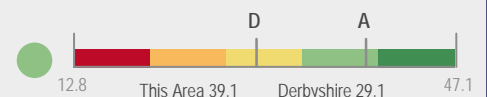


Satisfaction with opportunities for participating in local decision making 2006

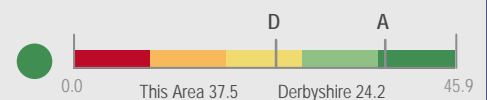

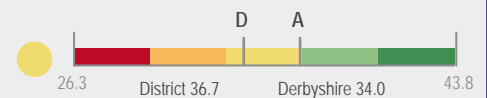
The Long Eaton and District 50+ Forum has 216 members. They seek to:

- raise awareness of housing and the environment in the area.

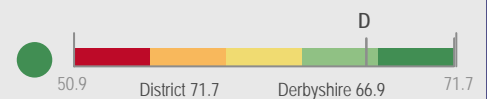

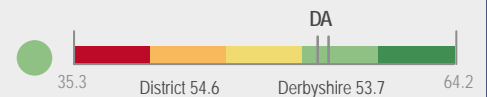
Residents who have formally volunteered in the last 3 years 2006

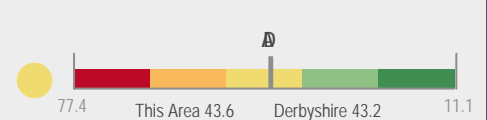
Residents who have informally volunteered for a non-relative in the last 3 years 2006

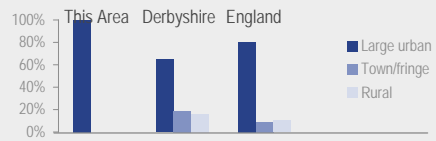
Residents who think people not treating each other with respect and consideration is a problem in their local area 2006

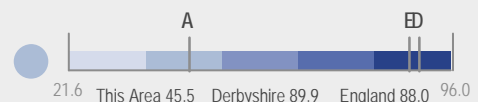


Percentage of people who think that "abandoned or burnt out cars" is a problem		2006

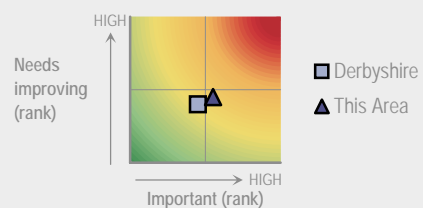

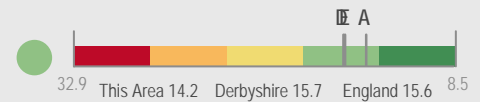
**Low income populations: all** 2004

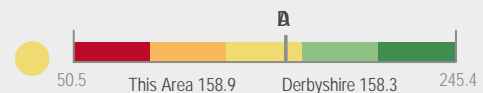


Residents' use of theatres and concert halls			2006

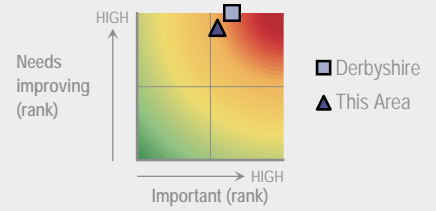

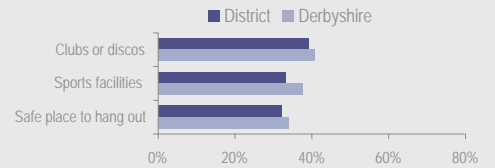

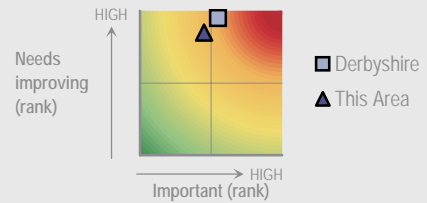

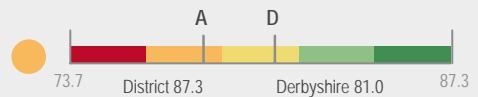


Residents' views on:- Road and pavement repairs			2006

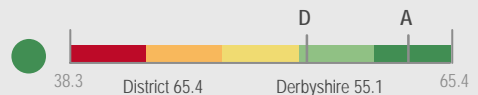

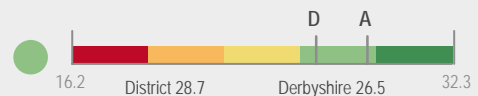
