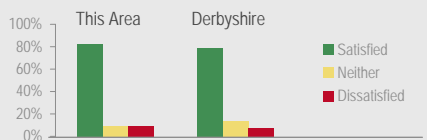
There are two Lower Layer Super Output Areas in the Glossop Community Area ranked in the 20% most

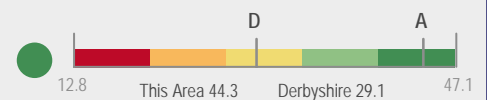


Satisfaction with opportunities for participating in local decision making 2006

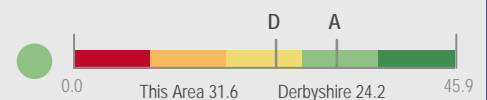

Glossop Action for Local Older People has 110 members. The group is working to:

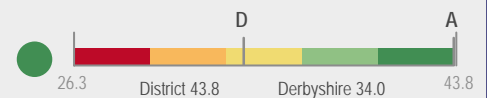
- consolidate membership of GALOP;

- develop, with partners, the 'Message in a Bottle' initiative, which encourages people to have a copy of emergency information in a safe place.

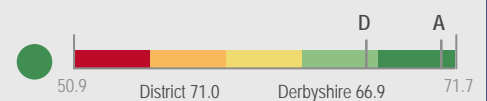

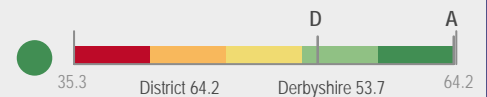

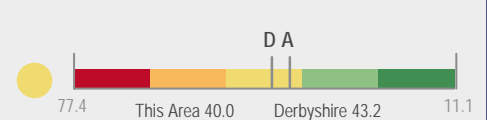
Residents who have informally volunteered for a non-relative in the last 3 years 2006

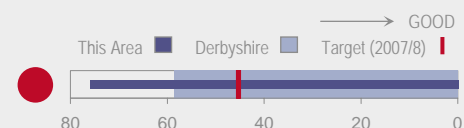


Residents' views on the frequency of: Vandalism and graffiti	2006

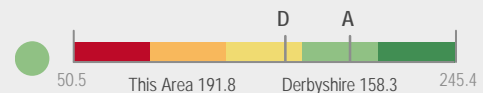


Residents' use of theatres and concert halls			2006

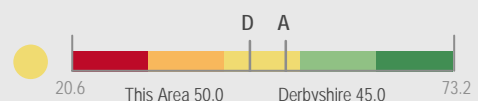
Residents who use the internet at home	2005
