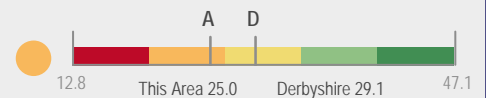


Satisfaction with opportunities for participating in local decision making 2006

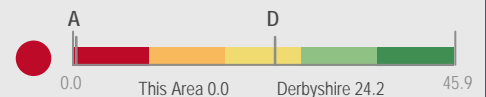

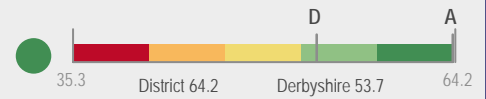
Residents who have formally volunteered in the last 3 years 2006

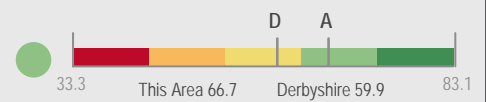
Residents who have informally volunteered for a relative in the last 3 years 2006

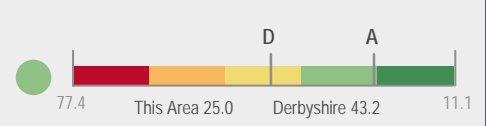
Residents who have informally volunteered for a non-relative in the last 3 years 2006

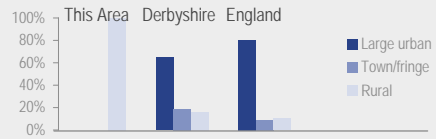
Residents who think people not treating each other with respect and consideration is a problem in their local area 2006

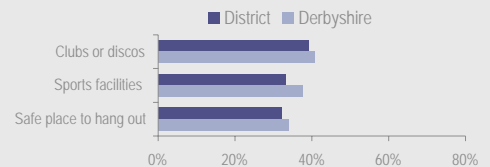
What young people most like doing

Tourism

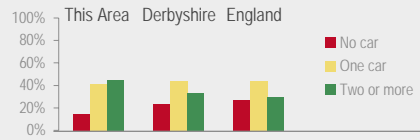
Tourist attractions in the area include:

- Freshfields** Meadows with a wood, a picnic courtyard and a barn with all the donkeys.
- Blue John Cavern and Blue John Mine** A range of natural water-worn caverns with stalactites and stalagmites.
- Peak Cavern** The largest natural cavern in the district.
- Peveril Castle** A ruined Norman castle on the hill high above Castleton, built in the 11thC.
- Speedwell Cavern** An 18thC lead mine and natural cavern which is visited by boat.
- Treak Cliff Cavern** An underground show cavern with examples of stalactites and stalagmites.
- Upper Derwent Reservoirs** Ladybower, Derwent and Howden reservoirs with woodland and lakeside walks.

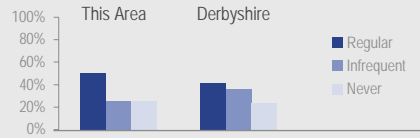

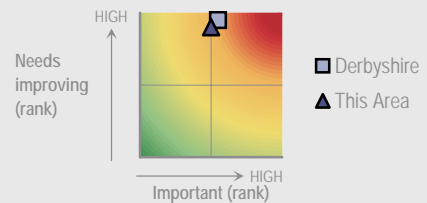
Residents' views on:- Level of traffic congestion			2006

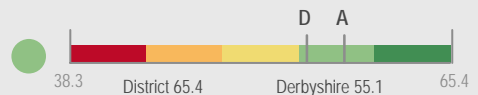

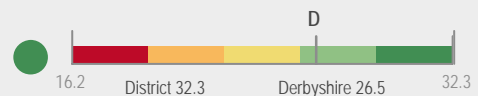

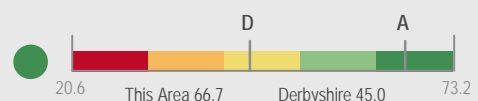
Residents who use the internet at home	2005
