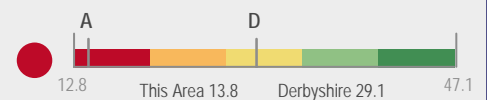


Satisfaction with opportunities for participating in local decision making 2006

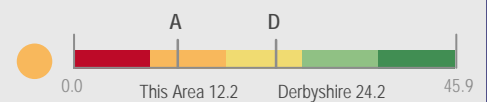

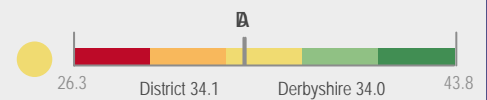
Chesterfield 50+ Inspired Group has 121 members. Their primary objectives are to;

- develop a chiropody service for the area.

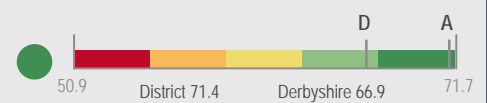

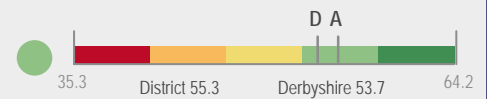

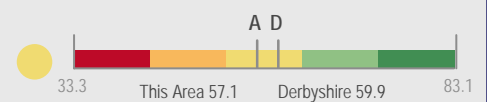
Residents who have informally volunteered for a relative in the last 3 years 2006

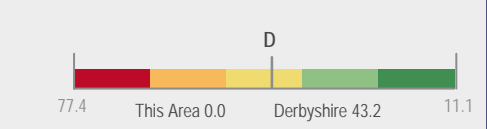

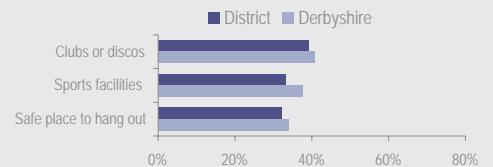
What young people most like doing
