

Community Profile



This area profile is the first stage in drawing together a range of information about a particular geographical area and its communities. The profile brings together basic statistical and consultation data and, where available, performance information and details about key initiatives in the area. There are 10 sections following the Audit Commission's quality of life themes. The profile aims to provide a more rounded picture of an area than can be achieved by viewing the information in isolation and should be used as a tool to provide a context and overview of an area, rather than detailed analysis of a particular topic or information type.



The Melbourne area lies to the east of the South Derbyshire district of Derbyshire. It covers an area of 9,922 hectares. Population lies predominately to the east of the area and includes the town of town of Melbourne, and several village settlements. The area borders the City of Derby on its northern boundary, and the county of Leicestershire on its eastern and southern boundaries.

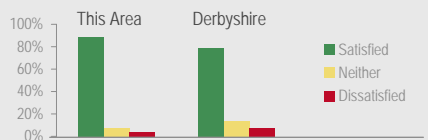

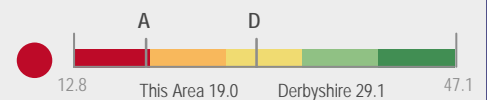


Satisfaction with opportunities for participating in local decision making 2006

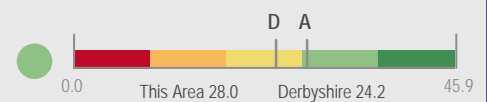

- improve access to information for Forum members in consultation with social services in relation to

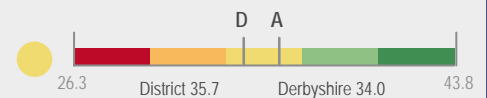
services provided, and through the use of Gold Card and other relevant publications;

- consult with older peoples groups in South Derbyshire on working towards an 'Out of Hours Service' that better meets the needs of the 50+ community.

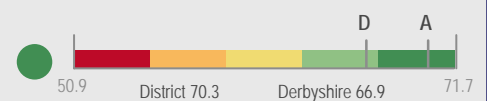

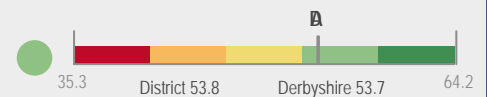
Residents who have formally volunteered in the last 3 years 2006

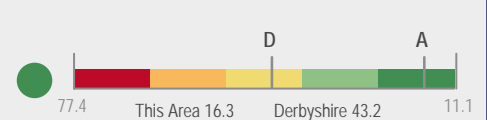
Residents who have informally volunteered for a non-relative in the last 3 years 2006

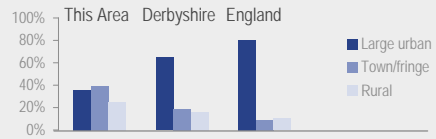
Residents who think people not treating each other with respect and consideration is a problem in their local area 2006

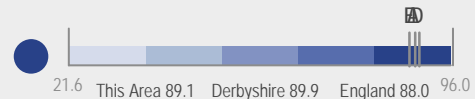

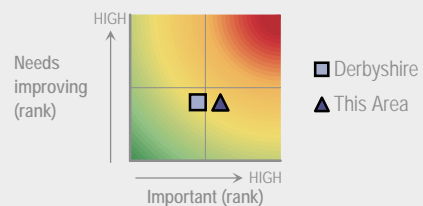

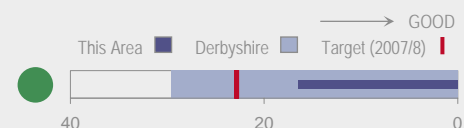


Residents' views on the frequency of: Vandalism and graffiti	2006

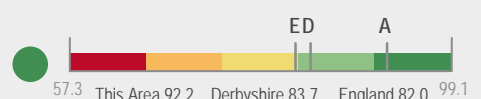
Level 2 at key stage 1 in reading

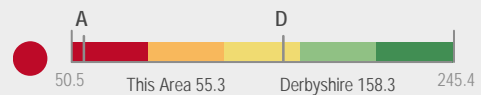


Residents' use of theatres and concert halls			2006

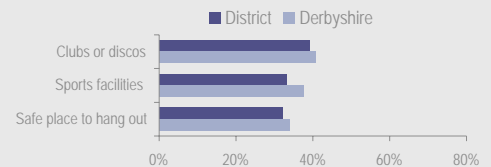
What young people most like doing

Thriving young arboretum and woodland garden established in 1992.

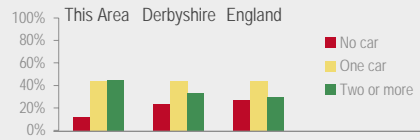

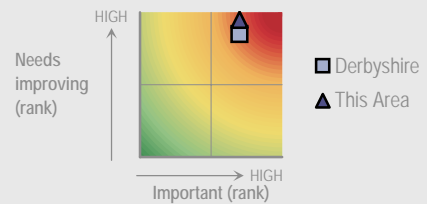
Residents use of local bus services			2006

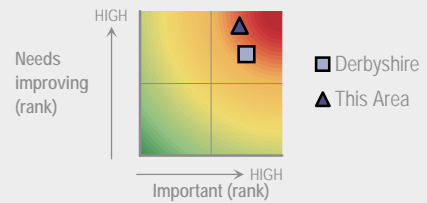

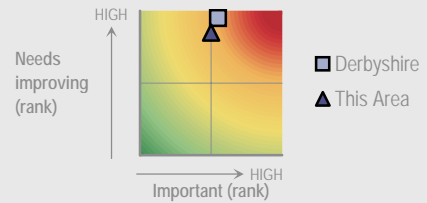

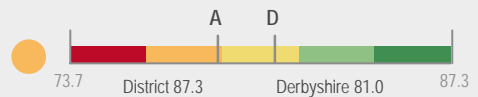

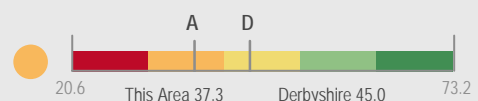
Residents who use the internet at home	2005
