**Proposed Development at land adjacent to Bramley Moor Lane, Marsh Lane
Ordnance Survey Grid Reference: 439814 (easting) 378401 (northing)

I give notice that INEOS Upstream Ltd is applying to Derbyshire County Council for planning permission for the construction of a well site and creation of a new access track, mobilisation of drilling, ancillary equipment and contractor welfare facilities to drill a vertical hydrocarbon exploratory core well and mobilisation of workover rig, listening well operations, and retention of the site and wellhead assembly gear for a temporary period of 5 years. The proposed development does not accord with the provisions of the development plan in force in the area in which the land to which the application relates is situated.

The Council thinks that the development would affect the setting of some listed buildings and the character or appearance of a conservation area.
