Text Image Magnifyer

Printed text, written text and images can be enlarged on to a screen, this can be adjusted to suit individual requirements.

Supernova

Supernova software is available on Public Access computers in all Derbyshire Libraries. The software consists of a screen magnifier that will enlarge text and images on screen and a screen reader that will read the text. The software can be used with Word and also the Internet.

Kurzweil 1000

This is an advanced reading system that makes the printed word accessible to Visually Impaired People. Text is scanned in to the memory using a scanner, this is then read back using a realspeak voice which is one of the best synthetic voices available. It is possible to then print out the text in either Large Print or Braille.

Transcription Service

This can be tailored to individual needs.

Braille

Braille is available in Grade 1 or Grade 2.

Braille for Infants

This is a reading scheme designed for young infants learning to read through Braille.

Consists of 27 Braille reading booklets, 2 activity cassettes and a teacher's handbook in print.

Firsthand

This course is designed to teach adults of any age to touch read and write Grade 1 Braille in such areas as labelling and reading and writing short notes. It is not designed to use as a "teach yourself" course and should be taught by someone with a good knowledge of Braille. On completion of volume 4 the learner can chose to transfer to volume 2 of fingerprint to learn Grade 2 Braille, or stay with Grade 1 and finish the remaining volumes of Firsthand.

Consists of 7 volumes of Braille and a teacher's guide in print

Fingerprint by Nigel Berry

This course is designed to teach newly-blind adults to touch-read and write Grade 2 Braille, no prior knowledge of Braille is needed.

Consists of 11 volumes of Braille and 10 cassettes. Tapescript and teachers notes are available.

Braille Made Easy – As Pye by Leslie Pye

This course is designed to teach Grade 1 Braille.

Consists of 1 volume in jumbo Braille and 1 audio cassette.

Upgrade Your Braille – A second slice of Pye

By Leslie Pye

This is the sequel to the previous item and is designed to take the student on to learn Grade 2 Braille.

Consists of 1 volume in standard Braille and 1 audio cassette.

Beginning Braille by Michael Tobin

This course is designed to be used either as a “teach-yourself” course or with a teacher; much of the course is in jumbo Braille that may be easier to feel for many beginners.

Consists of 4 volumes of Braille, 4 audio cassettes and explanatory notes in print.

Braille Primer

The Braille Primer is suitable for sighted people wishing to learn grade 2 Braille by sight.

A guide to the signs of Grade 2 Braille and the rules governing their use.

RNIB Dot to Dot

Complete learning course aimed at sighted and visually impaired people

Moon

The Moon Cats Reading scheme

This is a reading scheme for infants learning to read through moon.

Consists of 20 moon books, 1 teachers guide in print and 6 audio cassettes.

Journey Round The Moon

This course is designed for learning Grade 1 Moon from scratch, mainly for adults.

Consists of 4 volumes of Moon plus an alphabet and sign book.

Moon Journey Phase 2

A teaching course for grade 2 moon.

Consists of 1 grade 2 Moon book, 1 large print, 1 Braille book and 1 audio cassette.

We also have a collection of "Clear Vision" books, these are children's storybooks with a Braille overlay, and they are available in Grade 1 or Grade 2 Braille.

All the above are available for loan.
