

**THE DERBYSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (STONEY MIDDLETON BYWAY
OPEN TO ALL TRAFFIC No. 15 (JACOBS LADDER)) PROHIBITION OF
MECHANICALLY PROPELLED VEHICLES TRAFFIC REGULATION
ORDER 2019**

NOTICE is hereby given that an order (the Order) has been made by the Derbyshire County Council (the Authority) with the title above in exercise of its powers under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended (the Act) and any other enabling powers.

The general nature and effect of the Order is the permanent prohibition of all use by mechanically propelled vehicles on Stoney Middleton Byway Open to All Traffic No. 15, known as Jacob's Ladder, which is situated between eastern end of the Nook, Stoney Middleton, Derbyshire (Grid Reference SK 2323 7555), and its junction with New Road (Grid Reference SK 2344 7594), with exemptions in relation to:-

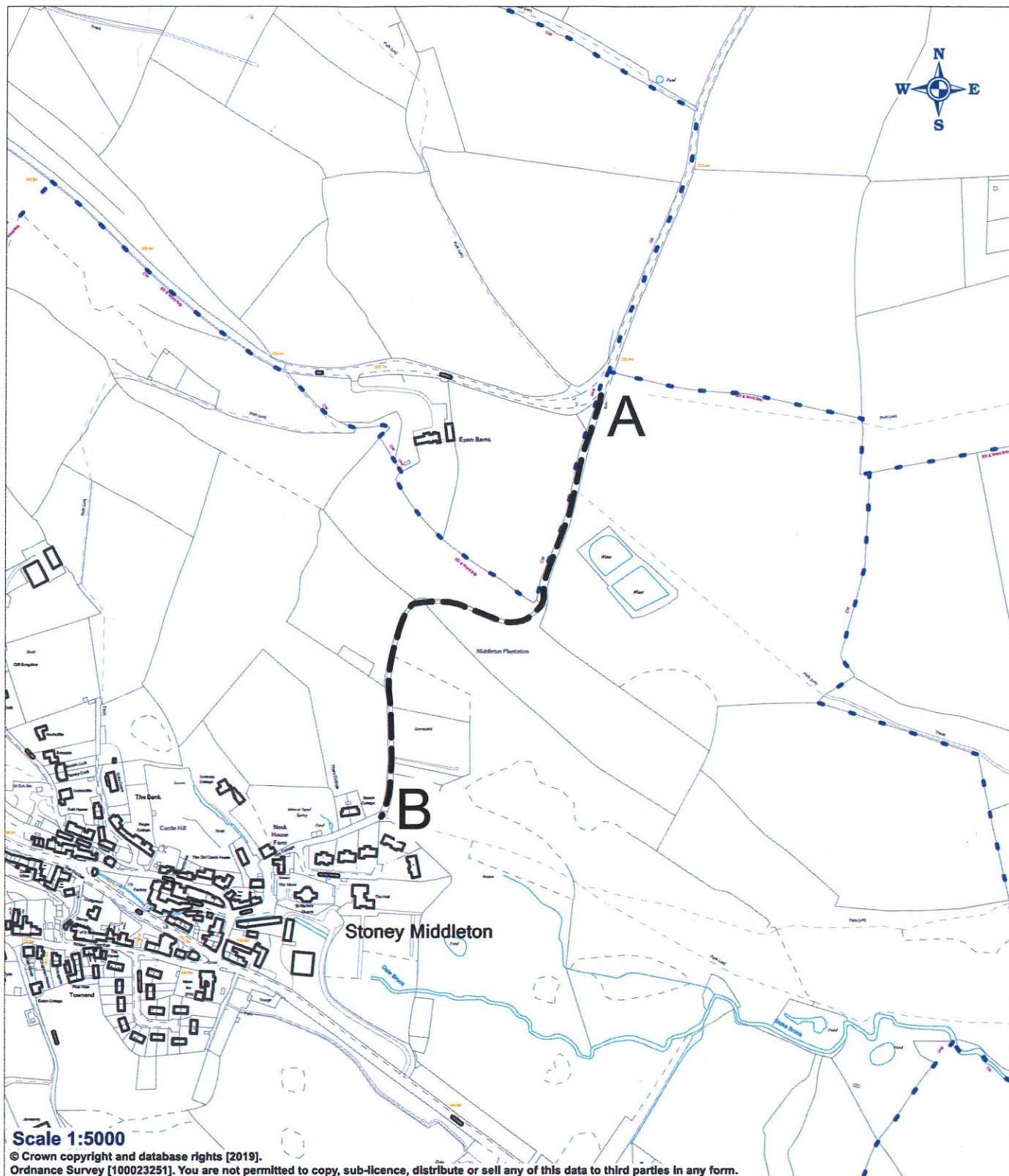
- a) use by emergency services or by any local authority or statutory undertakers
- b) use to enable work to be carried out in, on under or adjacent to the road
- c) use for access required to premises including for the purposes of agriculture or land management on any land or premises adjacent to the road
- d) use as an invalid carriage in accordance with the Use of Invalid Carriages on Highways Regulations 1988
- e) access to the graveyard situated on the eastern side of the road
- f) use upon the direction of or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform
- g) use with the prior written permission of the Authority on such terms as may be required by the Authority.

The Order is to come into force on Friday 2nd August 2019.

Documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order including a map showing the length of road affected by the Order may be viewed at www.derbyshire.gov.uk/rightsofwaytro and are available for inspection free of charge at County Hall at Smedley Street, Matlock, Derbyshire DE4 3AG from 9am to 5pm Monday to Friday (closed Bank and Public Holidays) and at Eyam Post Office 9am – 5:30pm Monday to Friday, 9am – 12:30pm Saturday (closed Bank and Public Holidays).

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with, that person may within six weeks from 22nd July 2019 (being the date on which the order was made) apply for the purpose to the High Court.
