To agree new Instruments of Government to be made under the School Governance (Constitution) (England) Regulations 2012.

Information and Analysis

The following proposals have been received from school Governing Bodies and they comply with the requirements of the Regulations:-

- (1) Longford CE Primary School – 10 members comprising 3 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher, 2 Foundation and 2 co-opted governors.
- (2) Tintwistle CE Aided Primary School - 14 members comprising 2 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher, 8 Foundation and 1 co-opted governors.
- (3) Coton in the Elms CE VC Primary School - 13 members comprising 4 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher, 3 Foundation and 3 co-opted governors.
- (4) St Mary's Catholic Primary School - 14 members comprising 2 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher, 8 Foundation and 1 co-opted governors.
- (5) Langley Infant School - 10 members comprising 3 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher and 4 co-opted governors.
- (6) Dunston Nursery and Primary School - 8 members comprising 2 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher and 3 co-opted governors.
- (7) Grange Primary School - 12 members comprising 3 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher and 6 co-opted governors.
- (8) The Village Federation (Carsington and Hopton (Voluntary Aided) Church of England Primary School and Kirk Ireton Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School) - 15 members comprising 2 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher, 2 co-opted and 8 Foundation governors.
- (9) Gamesley Early Excellence Centre - 12 members comprising 4 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher and 5 co-opted governors.

(10) Peak School - 11 members comprising 4 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher and 4 co-opted governors.
