NEW INSTRUMENTS OF GOVERNMENT

Purpose of the Report

To agree new Instruments of Government to be made under the School Governance (Constitution) (England) Regulations 2012.

Information and Analysis

The following proposals have been received from school Governing Bodies to vary their Instrument of Government and they comply with the requirements of the Regulations:-

- (1) St George's Church of England Controlled Primary School – 10 members comprising 2 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher, 2 Foundation and 3 co-opted governors.
- (2) Lea Primary School – 12 members comprising 3 parent, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher and 6 co-opted governors.
- (3) Hady Primary School – 11members comprising 2 parent, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher and 6 co-opted governors.
- (4) Aldercar Infant and Nursery School – 8 members comprising 2 parent, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher and 3 co-opted governors.
- (5) Penny Acres and Wigley Federation – 9 members comprising 2 parent, 1 Local Authority, 1 staff, 1 Headteacher and 4 co-opted governors.
- (6) Parkside Community School - 16 members comprising 2 parent, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher and 11 co-opted governors.
- (7) The William Allitt School – 12 members comprising 2 parent, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 1 Headteacher and 7 co-opted governors.
- (8) The Dales Federation – 13 members comprising 2 parent, 1 Local Authority, 1 Staff, 2 Foundation, 1 Headteacher and 6 co-opted governors.
- (9) Whittington Green Community School – 11 members comprising 2 parent, 1 Local Authority, 1 staff, 1 Headteacher and 6 co-opted governors.
- (10) Repton Primary School – 11 members comprising 2 parent, 1 Local Authority, 1 staff, 1 Headteacher and 6 co-opted governors.
