NEW INSTRUMENTS OF GOVERNMENT

Purpose of the Report

To agree new Instruments of Government to be made under the School Governance (Constitution) (England) Regulations 2012.

Information and Analysis

The following proposals have been received from school Governing Bodies to vary their Instrument of Government and they comply with the requirements of the Regulations:

- (1) Dove Holes Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School – 10 members consisting of 3 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 staff, 1 Head-teacher, 2 foundation and 2 co-opted governors.
- (2) Hollingwood Primary School – 10 members comprising 2 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 staff, 1 Head-teacher and 5 co-opted governors.
- (3) Spire Junior School – 13 members consisting of 3 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 staff, 1 Head-teacher and 7 co-opted governors.
- (4) Stanton in Peak Church of England (Controlled) Primary School – 12 members consisting of 3 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 staff, 1 Head-teacher, 2 foundation and 4 co-opted governors.
- (5) The Park Schools Federation - 10 members consisting of 2 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 x staff, 1 x Head-teacher and 5 co-opted governors.
- (6) The Woodland Federation of Peak District Schools – 14 members consisting of 2 parents, 1 Local Authority, 1 staff, 1 Executive Head-teacher, 2 foundation, 1 ex-officio governor and 6 co-opted governors.
