**Community Safety Learning and Development
End of Year Report 2012 - 2013**

Purpose of Report

To inform the Cabinet Member – Health and Communities of the training courses delivered as part of the Community Safety Learning and Development programme 2012-2013.

Information and Analysis

The Community Safety Unit has provided training for a total of 1272 multi-agency delegates on 46 sessions of 13 different classroom based courses, and two e-learning modules during the 2012 - 2103 financial year. The breakdown of courses is as follows:

These figures are slightly lower than 2011/2012, (-122 delegates) due to the cancellation of three courses during Quarter 4. This decision was taken in order to concentrate resources on the development and delivery of training for the ASB Victims First Project.

Please note a further breakdown is available, (on request) which includes names of attendees on each course, by department and agency.

Feedback

The Community Safety Unit's training courses and events are highly regarded by multi agency professionals in Derbyshire. Over the year, 87% rated the courses and events very good (score 5) or excellent (score 6) overall.

Future Developments

ASB Victims First Project – The initial pilot of the ASB Victims First Training has been evaluated and revisions will be undertaken before further roll-out across the County. Chesterfield and Bolsover have been trained during the pilot phase. Amber Valley and North East Derbyshire will be trained next, followed by Derby City, South Derbyshire and Erewash and finally, High Peak and Derbyshire Dales.

Identifying Child Sexual Exploitation – A pilot course, aimed at Community Safety partners, was developed and delivered in May. The training which is co-delivered with colleagues from the Safeguarding Children Board was well received and it is proposed to add it to the core Community Safety Programme during 2013 / 2014.
