Report of the Director of Public Health

UPDATE ON A FAIRER, HEALTHIER DERBYSHIRE

1. Purpose of the report:

To update members on the distribution of *A Fairer, Healthier Derbyshire*, and the commitments received to support the recommendations within the report.

2. Information and analysis:

A Fairer, Healthier Derbyshire, the Director of Public Health's Annual Report for Derbyshire has been distributed to a wide range of partner organisations. In addition, staff from the Public Health team have presented the report to key Boards and Groups across the county. Representatives from stakeholder organisations have been asked to consider how they could make a material contribution towards the recommendations within the report.

A hard copy of the report was sent to all elected members of Derbyshire County Council and District/Borough Councils, the Chief Executive and Strategic Directors at Derbyshire County Council, the Chief Executives of District/Borough Councils, the Chief Officers and Chairs of the Clinical Commissioning Groups, the Chief Executives and Chairs at NHS provider organisations and the eight Councils for Voluntary Services across Derbyshire.

Public Health staff have made presentations to Cabinet; the Health and Wellbeing Board; Adult Care, Health and Communities and Economy, Transport and Environment Directorate Management Teams; the Adult Care Board; the Children and Young People's Trust Board; the Boards of Hardwick, North Derbyshire, Southern Derbyshire and Tameside and Glossop Clinical Commissioning Groups; Council meeting at Bolsover and North East Derbyshire District Councils; Bolsover Scrutiny Management Board; and Financial Action and Advice Derbyshire. The report has also been presented to Locality and Health Partnerships and Local Area Committees.

There has been much support expressed for the report. A number of organisations have supported the recommendations in principle, and are considering what commitments they can make. In addition, a number of specific commitments have been received, and these have been detailed in Appendix 1. Public Health staff that link to these organisations will continue to encourage firm commitments to contribute towards the recommendations.

In preparing this report the relevance of the following factors has been considered: financial, legal, prevention of crime and disorder, equality and diversity, human resources, environmental, health, property and transport considerations.

Organisation/Group	Commitment
Derby Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust	The Chief Executive reported that the recommendations from the report will be included within the organisation's Corporate Responsibility Strategy
Derbyshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust	The Chief Executive has requested support from Public Health to review the role the Trust can play in fulfilling recommendations, and the Trust are considering a range of actions that relate to their patients and workforce.
Cabinet	Healthy workplace proposal supported and in process of implementation
Economy, Transport and Environment DMT	Directorate to send an email to their staff regarding joining credit unions
Health and Communities DMT	Agreed to hold a workshop with the wider directorate to identify actions that would support the recommendations
Children and Young People's Trust Board	To feed recommendations into forthcoming CYP Plan
Hardwick CCG Board	The Board reported that this year's report is the best they've ever seen. The Board has developed an action plan across the recommendations, incorporating actions for the CCG and constituent practices. This includes a commitment to accreditation with the Living Wage Foundation by April 2015 and assessing the feasibility of constituent GP Practices becoming accredited by April 2016, promotion of credit unions amongst CCG and GP practice staff, continuing to support apprentices, and embedding social value into commissioning processes from April 2015.
North Derbyshire CCG Board	The Board will consider recommendations in forward CCG plan
Southern Derbyshire CCG Board	Chief Officer and Public Health Consultant to meet to discuss role of CCG in more detail
Financial Action and Advice Derbyshire	Members encouraged to see public health and financial inclusion so closely linked within the report. FAAD have provided detailed information on the role they can have in supporting recommendations linked to financial inclusion. However, they have also voiced concern that additional resources will be required to implement recommendations.
