April to September 2013****Purpose of Report**

To inform the Cabinet Member – Health and Communities of the progress made in delivering the Community Safety Learning and Development Plan 2013-2014, from April to September 2013.

Information and Analysis

The Community Safety Unit has provided training for a total of 751 delegates on 23 taught courses / workshops or e-learning modules, during the first six months of this financial year. The breakdown of courses is as follows:

- ASB E-Learning - Introduction
- ASB Victims First E-Learning – Module 1
- ASB Victims First E-Learning – Module 2
- Alcohol Harm Minimisation Workshop – one session
- ASB Victims First Champions Training – six sessions
- Community Safety Introduction – three sessions
- Hate Crime Awareness – three sessions
- Identifying Child Sexual Exploitation Training for Community Safety Partners – one session
- Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conference (MARAC) Champions Training – two sessions
- Multi-Agency Public Protection Arrangements (MAPPA) Foundation Training – one session
- WRAP (Workshop to Raise Awareness of Prevent) – four sessions

These events have been accessed by a wide variety of delegates from Derbyshire County Council Departments and our partner agencies. The table below provides a breakdown of the delegates by DCC department and organisation.

Please note a further breakdown is available, (on request) which includes names of attendees on each course, by department and agency.

Over the last six months, 91% of delegates rated the core courses and events very good (score 5) or excellent (score 6) overall, with the remainder scoring good (4).

The evaluation for the ASB Victims First Project training shows 77% of delegates rating 5 or 6 with the remainder scoring good (4). The training is developed and delivered in partnership with Derbyshire Constabulary and feedback has focused on the project itself rather than the training delivery. This feedback has helped inform the on-going roll out of the project.
