PLAN 2013/2014 END OF YEAR REPORT****1 Purpose of the report:**

To inform the Cabinet Member – Health and Communities of the training courses delivered as part of the Community Safety Learning and Development Plan 2013-2014.

2 Information and analysis:

The Community Safety Unit has provided and facilitated training for a total of 1681 delegates on 50 sessions of nine classroom based courses or workshops and five e-learning or workbook based modules, during the financial year 2013-2014. The breakdown of courses is as follows:

Please note a further breakdown is held which includes names of attendees on each course, by department and agency. This year we have trained an extra 409 delegates, compared to 2013/14 and many of these additional numbers are due to delegates completing the e-learning and workbook modules of the ASB Victims First training.

Feedback – Courses

During 2013 - 2014, 92% of delegates rated the core courses (*Introduction to Community Safety, MARAC, Hate Crime, Identifying CSE and WRAP*) very good or excellent overall. The comments show that the content is pitched correctly for the vast majority of our multi-

agency partners and many delegates say they would recommend these courses to their community safety colleagues.

Feedback – ASB Victims First Project, Champions Training

During the past 12 months, the Community Safety Unit has provided considerable resource regarding the course development, administration and delivery of the multi-agency Victims First Champions Training, in partnership with Derbyshire Constabulary. 22 sessions of the Champions training have been delivered for Managers / Sergeants and a revised e-learning package and workbook and been developed for front-line officers dealing with ASB. The Project has now rolled-out across Chesterfield, Bolsover, North East Derbyshire, Amber Valley, Erewash, South Derbyshire and Derby City, with Derbyshire Dales and High Peak areas to follow during early 2015.

The evaluation for the ASB Victims First Project training shows an average 82% of delegates rating very good or excellent, over the whole year 2013-2014. The Champions training, was revised half-way through the year following delegate feedback. After these changes were implemented, 89% of delegates now rate the training at 5 or 6, an increase of 15% in overall satisfaction levels (74% rated 5 or 6 prior to the changes). The training will continue to be monitored and revised throughout the next phase of the roll out.
