**Report of the Strategic Director, Commissioning, Communities and Policy**

**ARTS GRANTS, 2019-20**

**1. Purpose of the report:**

To seek Cabinet Member approval to award grants to nine community arts groups and the Live and Local rural and community touring scheme for 2019-20.

**2. Information and analysis:**

In accordance with Financial Regulations, all grants to external recipients must be approved and a departmental register maintained. Grants are payments of funds for a specific purpose. Examples include contributions towards an external party's core running costs, purchase or construction of specified assets, and the running of specific events.

There is also a requirement under the Local Government Transparency Code 2014 to publish information on grants awarded to voluntary, community and social enterprise organisations.

Nine community arts organisations have been in receipt of annual funding from the County Council for a number of years, as has the Live & Local rural and community touring scheme, which delivers arts performances in village halls and other community venues. All of these organisations support the Council's priorities and play an important role in helping vulnerable people in the community and care homes, those with learning difficulties and disadvantaged groups.

If agreed, the Head of Arts will continue to monitor the funded organisations and hold review meetings as appropriate. Each funded organisation is required to submit an annual report on their activities, with clear evaluation of the work, plus financial accounts and a three-year business plan.

Ten organisations have applied for funding for 2018-19, as listed below, and it is proposed to maintain the level of grants awarded at the same level as made in 2018/19.
