S106 PROJECT ALLOCATIONS – (YOUNG PEOPLE)****1. Purpose of Report**

To inform Cabinet of the receipt of recent Section 106 developer contributions and to seek approval for the allocation of those contributions to projects in line with the individual Section 106 agreements.

2. Information and Analysis

Appendix A details the S106 contributions that have been received by the Authority or are available to claim from the District/Borough Councils. The Appendix details the schools that are to benefit from the investment, together with the planned projects.

In addition, there is an amendment to be made to previously approved S106 funding in relation to 'Land at William Nadin Way, Swadlincote'. The amount of £192,056.77 was allocated to Stanton Primary School (approved 5 October 2017), a revised figure of £41,448.33 will be allocated to the school in line with the primary contribution and the remaining balance of £150,608.44 will be allocated to The Pingle School in line with the secondary contribution. The secondary contribution will be reported to Cabinet at a later date once a project has been identified.

3. Financial Considerations

The contributions are S106 Developer Contributions. Appendix A summarises the funds received and those available to claim. The contributions are awaiting allocation. The total is £332,846.

Where appropriate, it may be necessary to undertake a procurement exercise to commission services in order to undertake works associated with these schemes / budgets, and this report also seeks approval to commence this process. It should be noted that these procurement exercises would normally take the form of a competitive tender process, but should it be decided that using a Framework is the best option, a separate report will be submitted seeking approval for this.

4. Social Value Considerations

This funding is to ensure that there is sufficient capacity at all the schools involved. The schools will have the option to deliver the projects themselves under their own financial regulations. Where the projects are delivered by County Property, this will be done under its usual procedures.
