**Report of the Assistant Chief Executive**

**COMMUNITY PRIORITIES PROGRAMME**

**Strategic Leadership, Culture and Tourism**

**1. Purpose of the Report**

To provide an overview of the projects supported by the Community Priorities Programme over the last twelve months and to outline proposals to maximise spend over the remaining ten months of operation.

**2. Information and Analysis**

At its meeting on 24 May 2016, Cabinet agreed to establish a £2.271 million Community Priorities Programme using one off resources identified from General Reserves. The two year Programme, which has now been in place for over twelve months, targets and supports activity in designated geographical areas. Devolving funds to a local level to support community activities, particularly activity which helps communities help themselves, continues to support the Council's priorities and sits alongside current work on Thriving Communities.

The Community Priorities Programme aims to support the development of projects which meet real identified needs, build community capacity and resilience and are sustainable. As a minimum all projects are required to:

- Support activity principally benefiting the designated LSOA
- Support the aims and objectives of the Thriving Communities programme
- Link into Thriving Communities activity in areas where work is currently being piloted where possible
- Be time limited and not require ongoing funding from the Council
- Complement, not duplicate other funding sources such as the Public Health Locality Fund, the Members Community Leadership Scheme etc.
- Show how activity can be sustained beyond the life of the funding

- Meet an identified need which can be evidenced through for example, English Indices of Deprivation, the Derbyshire Quilt etc.
- Be delivered within agreed timescales
- Show how local people have helped in the design of identified activity or have been consulted/engaged
- Show what difference is being made.

Since the programme was established in May 2016, 136 Community Priorities projects, totalling £1,303,342, have been approved with regular updates on progress being made to the Cabinet Member for Strategic Policy, Economic Development and Budget. A full list of projects supported during this time is now attached at Appendix A for information. Monitoring of those projects which have been approved to date is currently taking place to ensure funds have been, or are in the process of being, spent on agreed activity.

### **Moving Forward**

Approximately 57% of the Community Priorities Programme total allocation has been spent in its first year of operation, leaving £967,658 available for projects over the forthcoming year. A number of projects are currently in the process of being developed in localities eligible for support and this work continues to be supported by staff in the Policy and Research Division who liaise with Elected Members to ensure identified activity meets eligibility criteria, involves local people in its design and is sustainable moving forward. Despite these efforts a number of areas have been unable to fully spend their allocations.

Work to support Elected Members in identifying suitable projects will continue. However to ensure that the Programme achieves its aims and makes the best use of the available funding during its final year of operation, it is proposed that there is greater flexibility in the geographical areas targeted by the Programme during this time. This flexibility will enable Elected Members to have discretion to allocate funding, which has not yet been committed, to projects within their electoral division which meet all other Community Priorities Programme eligibility criteria. Projects will still have to demonstrate that proposed activity meets an identified need which can be evidenced and for those projects in areas which do not principally benefit the original designated target LSOA, also support a priority or priorities set out within the new Council Plan. Elected Members will be issued with guidance and informed of the remaining allocation of funding for their area.

The Programme will run until the end of June 2018. Funds which have not been committed – approved through the relevant process for the level of grant awarded - at this point in time will subsequently be returned to the General Reserve.

Moving forward, it is recommended that updates on progress continue to be reported to the Cabinet Member for Strategic Leadership, Culture and Tourism on a quarterly basis. A full evaluation of the Programme will also commence shortly. This will be important in demonstrating the impact that funding has had on local people and communities and identifying lessons learned to support the development of future funding programmes the Council may wish to undertake.

### **3. Financial Considerations**

To ensure that there is compliance with the Council's Financial Regulations, all approved projects will be issued with standard conditions of grant and will be subject to monitoring and evaluation. Funding which has not been committed at the end of the Programme - 30 June 2018, will be returned to the General Reserve.

### **4. Equality and Diversity Considerations**

The Community Priorities Programme has targeted support to the most deprived and disadvantaged areas of the county. In addition funding has supported a number of groups working with vulnerable people and communities.

### **5. Social Value Considerations**

The Community Priorities Programme has, and will continue to support the development of projects in the 50% most deprived LSOAs in the county, engaging with local people and supporting the improvement of the social, economic and environmental wellbeing of the communities concerned.

### **6. Other Considerations**

In preparing this report the relevance of the following factors has been considered; legal, prevention of crime and disorder, environmental, human resources, health, property and transport considerations.
