**MANAGING THE TRANSITION OF COMMISSIONED PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES IN GLOSSOPDALE FROM TAMESIDE TO DERBYSHIRE
(Health and Communities)**

1 Purpose of the report:

To seek approval to continue to commission children's public health services for Glossop via Tameside Metropolitan Borough Council for 2015/16.

2 Information and analysis:

Until April 2013, responsibility for the commissioning and provision of public health services for the population of Glossopdale was held by Tameside and Glossop Primary Care Trust. Since 1 April 2013 that responsibility has transferred to the County Council.

To ensure a smooth transition and sufficient time to re-procure services, Tameside Metropolitan Borough Council ('Tameside MBC') agreed to continue commissioning public health services for Glossopdale for an additional year through to end of March 2014.

Re-procurement of public health services for Glossop from April 2014 was incorporated into the re-procurement of public health services across Derbyshire, as described in the Public Health report approved by Cabinet on 30 July 2013. During 2014/15 all public health services previously commissioned on our behalf by Tameside MBC are now directly commissioned by the County Council, with the exception of children's services.

Children's public health services in Derbyshire have been re-procured and the contract is close to signature. The new service, which will include Glossop, has a two-phase commencement. School nursing, child health promotion and prevention of smoking uptake services will commence on 1 October 2015 and health visiting services will commence on 1 April 2016. Tameside MBC has agreed to continue to commission the current children's services for Glossop on the Council's behalf until these new services start:

• Family Weight Management service to 30/9/15	£ 1,425
• Children's Healthy Nutrition/Obesity to 30/9/15	£ 11,527
• Children and Young People Health Mentor programme to 30/9/15	£ 5,299
• School Nursing Service to 30/9/15	£ 79,141
• Early Attachment service to 31/3/16	£ 16,464
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Total for all services 2015/16	£113,856

3 Financial considerations:

The County Council and Tameside Metropolitan Borough Council have agreed the budget figures for the services described above. The cost will be met from the 2015/16 ring-fenced Public Health budget.

4 Legal considerations:

The Director of Legal Services will work with Public Health and Tameside MBC colleagues to support the transition of the commissioning responsibilities set out in this report.

5 Other considerations:

In preparing this report the relevance of the following factors has been considered: prevention of crime and disorder, equality of opportunity, human rights, human resources, environmental, health, property and transport considerations.
