

Public Questions

Cabinet arrangements allow for the consideration of questions from members of the public. In keeping with the Constitution's principles of openness and supporting the active involvement of citizens in the process of the Council's decision-making, the Cabinet agenda for the open part of the meeting provides for questions from members of the public.

Members of the public in attendance at the meeting may ask a question arising from an agenda item and may ask one supplementary question arising directly from the original question or the reply. Fifteen minutes will normally be allowed for public questions. The provision of written questions the day before the meeting (not exceeding 200 words and addressed to Roy Ackrill at roy.ackrill@derbyshire.gov.uk) is encouraged.
