1. Purpose of Report

To inform the Panel of proposed assessment criteria to support the implementation of review proposals to be included a work programme.

2. Information and Analysis

The Panel discussed at its meeting on 24 March 2016 various proposals for proactive areas of work which could be undertaken to support and challenge the PCC. It was agreed that it would be of benefit to have an assessment criteria in order for the Panel to decide which review proposals would add value to the Panel's duty of challenge and support of the PCC.

The suggested criteria are based on five 'key questions' which the Panel can ask of each proposed review. The more questions answered 'yes', the more the proposed review has met the assessment criteria. The proposed assessment criteria can be seen in Appendix One. Two proposed reviews are filled in as a way of examples of how the criteria can be used.

3. Other considerations

In preparing this report the relevance of the following factors has been considered: financial, legal, prevention of crime and disorder, equality and diversity, human resources, environmental, health and transport considerations.

Review Assessment Criteria

The following table provides the criteria in which a proposed review of an area of proactive challenge and support of the PCC should meet.

The more Yes' answered, the more the proposed review has met the assessment criteria.

Title of proposed review	Is the proposed review outside of Police Operational matters? Yes/No	Does the proposed review impact on one or more of the Police and Crime Plan objectives? Yes/No	Will the review be the first time the issues have been addressed? Yes/No	Are the issues in the proposed review being assessed as a risk? Yes/No	Will the review lead to timely recommendations for the PCC? Yes/No	Number of Yes'
