**Report of the Strategic Director Adult Care and Public Health**

**SUSTAINABILITY AND TRANSFORMATION PLAN FOR DERBYSHIRE**

**1. Purpose of the report**

To outline the proposed role and responsibilities of the Derbyshire Health and Wellbeing Board in relation to the development and implementation of the Sustainability and Transformation Plan for Derbyshire.

**2. Information and Analysis**

The NHS is required to produce a five year Sustainability and Transformation Plan (STP), which is place-based and drives the local delivery of the [NHS Five Year Forward View](#).

The timetable for the development of the STP is ambitious and the full draft plan needs to be submitted to NHS England by the end of June 2016. The HWB has previously received a report detailing the timescales for the agreeing the governance, development and submission of the STP on the agreed Derbyshire and Derby City transformation footprint.

The STP is to be built around an understanding of the needs of the local population and local health systems in relation to:

- The finance and efficiency gap;
- The health and wellbeing gap; and
- The quality and care gap.

In addition local challenges where patients and populations need to see most improvement should be detailed and this will help identify the key priorities to be tackled over the next five years in order to achieve the sustainable transformation of the health and social care system

[NHS Delivering the Five Year Forward View – Planning Guidance 2016/17-2020/21](#) notes that place-based planning is dependent on: "...an open, engaging and iterative process that harnesses the energies of clinicians, patients, carers, citizens and local community partners including the independent and voluntary sectors, and local government through health and wellbeing boards."

It is clear that the HWB needs to have a significant role in both the development, delivery and oversight of the STP as this will enable the Board to fulfil its duties to encourage integration, promote the health and wellbeing of the local population and support the delivery of its key objectives outlined in the Health and Wellbeing Strategy.

Derby City Council HWB approved a report on 24 March 2016 which agreed a number of responsibilities for the Board in relation to the STP. It is proposed that the Derbyshire HWB also agrees to fulfil this same role, in relation to:

- Supporting the development of, and help shape the STP – particularly in relation to the health and wellbeing gap and through the HWB playing a key leadership role;
- Playing a key role in the implementation and delivery of the STP within the administrative county of Derbyshire;
- Providing oversight and play a role as ‘critical friend; in both the development and delivery of the STP, providing a ‘safe space’ for wider debate and discussion by system leaders;
- Providing an understanding of the wider determinants of health and wellbeing and provide links to key stakeholders.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS**

The Health and Wellbeing Board is asked to:

1. Note the HWB’s significant role in the development and delivery of the Derbyshire Sustainability and Transformation Plan.
2. Agrees that the HWB fulfils the responsibilities outlined in the report in relation to the development and implementation of the Sustainability and Transformation Plan.
