HEALTH AND WELLBEING BOARD ROUND-UP REPORT

1. Purpose of the report

To provide the Board with a round-up of key progress in relation to Health and Wellbeing issues and projects not covered elsewhere on the agenda.

2. Round-Up**Developing patient participation**

The National Association for Patient Participation has published a resource guide called [Building better participation](#). The document, written in conjunction with NHS England, is designed to be of use to all GP practice Patient Participation Groups to help them to reflect on what they do, how they work and how they might become more effective.

The older people's health and wellbeing profile

Public Health England has published a [tool](#) which enables identification, comparison and monitoring of trends that can be used to examine the health and care of older people across local authorities in England. The profile is designed to support those responsible for delivering strategies for prevention and early intervention to improve the health and wellbeing of older adults, as well as those providing evidence and intelligence to support the development of Joint Strategic Needs Assessments for their local area.

Reshaping the workforce

The Nuffield Trust has published [Reshaping the workforce to deliver the care patients need](#). This report examines how best NHS staffing can be reorganised to support new ways of delivering care to patients. It finds that equipping the existing non-medical workforce, NHS nursing, community and support staff with additional skills is the best way to develop the capacity of the health service workforce. The paper provides practical guidance on implementation to those wishing to reshape their workforce.

Older carers in the United Kingdom

Age UK has released new figures showing that the [age of carers has increased](#) over the past seven years with the number of carers aged 80 and

over rising from 301,000 to 417,000, an increase of nearly 39%. The data indicates that one in seven people aged 80 and over provide some form of care to family or friends. The figures also show that 144,000 carers in this age group are caring for someone in their home for more than 35 hours a week, while a further 156,000 are caring for more than 20 hours a week.

The future of GP collaborative working

This [report](#) from the Royal College of General Practitioners showcases how GPs are designing and leading innovative schemes to improve the integration of care in the best interests of patients. It highlights seven case studies spanning a wide range of services across the UK, covering different specialties, different population groups and different ways of addressing complex issues. It includes a case study from Thornbrook Surgery in Chapel-en-le-Frith who has employed a psychotherapist to help patients with mental health issues. Analysis has found that more patients attend this service and that there is reduced stigma as patients can be seen closer to home.

Social prescribing

The Local Government Association has published a report entitled [Just what the doctor ordered: social prescribing: a guide for local authorities](#). This report focuses on how social prescribing can be used to help an ageing population and supporting people with long-term conditions, by connecting people with local community services and activities. The document includes case studies of social prescribing schemes from across the country.

Emotional wellbeing and mental health for children and young people

The Local Government Association has published [Best start in life: promoting good emotional wellbeing and mental health for children and young people](#).

This briefing provides examples of councils that are looking at innovative ways to provide support with a focus on children and families rather than static services, as well as more information.

Report examines suicide by children and young people in England

The National Confidential Inquiry into suicide and homicide by people with mental illness, has published a [report](#) which considers suicide by children and young people in England. The report found that there were 145 suicides and probable suicides by children and young people in England between January 2014 and April 2015. The suicide rate in this age group is low overall, but is highest in the late teens. The majority of deaths were in males (70%). Over a quarter (28%) had been bereaved, 36% had a physical health condition with the most common conditions being acne and asthma. Academic pressures were common and almost a third of those in education were facing exams or exam results at the time of death. The majority (54%) had indicated their risk through previous self-harm and 27% had expressed suicidal ideas in the week before they died. Almost half (43%) were not known to any service or agency

Quality of care in a local area: Salford and Tameside

The Care Quality Commission has published a further two prototype reports looking at how the [quality of care in a local area](#) can be assessed. The reports, covering Salford and Tameside, aim to inform the public about the quality of their local services and how well they work together, and for commissioners where they need to improve to serve local public better.

End of life care for LGBT people

Charitable organisation Marie Curie Cancer Care has published [Hiding who I am: exposing the reality of end of life care for LGBT people](#). This report looks at the barriers that prevent lesbian, gay, bisexual and trans (LGBT) people from accessing end of life care and highlights their real-life experiences. It draws on interviews with LGBT people living with a terminal illness, and their partners. Many people interviewed said they felt anxiety about having to hide who they are when accessing end of life care, with one in four experiencing discrimination from health and social care professionals in their lifetime.

National Audit Office examine issue of delayed transfers of care

The National Audit Office has conducted [an investigation](#) into unnecessary delays in discharging older people from acute hospitals. It presents a deteriorating situation of rising demand and reduced funding which are putting huge pressure on local health and care systems. From an individual point of view, it describes how people's health and independence is compromised by spending time in hospital when this is not needed.

Personal budgets in social care

This Public Accounts Committee [report](#) warns that stronger measures are needed to safeguard the interests of adults receiving personal budgets for social care. The Committee calls on the Department of Health to set out clearly to local authorities and providers 'what high-quality and proportionate support looks like' and how much it costs, and recommends a range of analytical and other measures to safeguard users' interests and the social care market.

Notification of Pharmacy Applications

Under the requirements of the National Health Service (Pharmaceutical and Local Pharmaceutical Services) Regulations 2013 the NHS Commissioning Board must notify the HWB of all relevant applications to provide pharmaceutical services, including the relocation of existing pharmacies.
