HEALTH AND WELLBEING BOARD ROUND-UP REPORT

1. Purpose of the report

To provide the Board with a round-up of key progress in relation to Health and Wellbeing issues and projects not covered elsewhere on the agenda.

2. Round-Up

Chief Medical Officer Annual report

The Department of Health has published Annual report of the Chief Medical Officer 2016: Generation Genome. This report discusses the current state of genomic service provision in the NHS in England and explores the potential of genomics to improve health and prevent ill-health. It presents evidence and discourse around screening, diagnosing rare diseases and the use of genomics in personalised prevention. It makes recommendations to address gaps in infrastructure; public engagement; organisation of research; and provision of services in order to widen access to genomic services.

Social value of sheltered housing

DEMOS has published The social value of sheltered housing. This briefing paper brings together qualitative data relating to the savings generated to health and social care services. It provides a review of the existing evidence regarding the impact of sheltered housing and makes some initial estimates as to the cost savings it can achieve in a range of fields.

Housing health and wellbeing outcomes for our older populations

Housing LIN has published Putting Older People First in the North West: A whole system approach to meeting housing, health and wellbeing outcomes for our older populations in North West England. This document also sets out the national policy context, the care sector workforce challenge and the evidence that integration of specialist housing and the use of technology enabled care facilitates independent living and can reduce demand for health and social care services.

Social care survey

The director of adult social services (ADASS) has published the latest ADSS budget survey 2017. This annual survey provides an analysis of the state of adult social care finances drawn from the experiences of current leaders in adult social care. It provides intelligence on how adult social care is responding to the multiple challenges of meeting increased expectations and need, whilst managing resources in an environment where Local Government funding is reducing.

Sustainability and transformation plans

The Institute for Public Policy Research (IPPR) has published Sustainability and transformation plans (STPs): what, why and where next? This report looks at the most promising reform solutions that have been correctly identified by STPs, and also sets out the range of challenges that stand in the way of them realising their vision for improved health and efficiency.

Reforming social care

Reform the independent think-tank has published Social care: a prefunded solution. This paper makes the case for much more fundamental reform: replacing the current 'pay-as-you-go' (PAYG) approach to financing later-life care with a prefunded arrangement. Under this proposal, working-age people would contribute a percentage of their income into a Later Life Care Fund (LLCF). These pooled savings would then be managed privately, before being used to fund the care costs of those that contributed.

Advancing care: research with care homes

The National Institute for Health Research has published a report which provides a themed review that examines what works most effectively to improve care for older people in care homes. The report covers three themes:

- Living well, maintaining good health and quality of life.
- Ageing well, managing long term conditions associated with ageing.
- Dying well, ensuring a good quality end of life.

Supporting working carers

Think Local Act Personal has published a report which offers good practice examples that demonstrate how employers are making significant progress with supporting an increasing number of working carers. Also published are 'Top Tips' which has been developed for employers detailing the actions they can take to ensure that carers are supported within the workplace.

Rebooting health and social care integration: an agenda for ore person centred care

Localis has published a report which finds that the health and social care integration agenda has a future but it is dependent on moving away from notions of structural integration and reliance on central policy direction. The

report concludes that the issue of funding and financial sustainability is critical but can only be influenced locally. The report also sets out how health and social care integration can create new value locally, but it must build on its most important point of consensus; greater person centred care. The report makes four strategic recommendations and six policy recommendations to support integration.

2017 Health Profiles

Public Health England has published the 2017 Health Profiles. The Profiles provide a snapshot of health and wellbeing for each local authority in England using a range of charts and text. The Profiles pull together existing information in one place and contain data on a range of indicators for local populations. For Derbyshire the following indicators are classified as worse than the national average: GCSE attainment, Smoking status at the time of delivery, hospital stays for alcohol specific conditions (aged 18 and under), excess weight In adults, hospital stays for self-harm, hospital stays for alcohol related harm, recorded diabetes, killed and seriously injured on the roads and excess winter deaths. In addition, Public Health England has published a report, which provides a picture of population health data for England

LGA published fourth annual review for Health and Wellbeing Boards

The LGA has published the latest annual summary describing how the most effective HWBs are acting as 'anchors of place' as health and care integration and new models of care develop. The report contains a number of key messages, including that HWB's need to fulfil a place leadership role, considering the wider determinants of health and making sure they have traction with local STPs. HWBs need to shape the long term vision, the direction of travel and provide the strategic context for population health and wellbeing. The report acknowledges that areas which have a Director of Public Health that understands this agenda is critical. The report acknowledges that in many places the geography is challenging, therefore a flexible approach needs to be adopted and where appropriate working with neighbouring HWB's needs to take place.

Suicide by children and young people

The National Confidential Inquiry into Suicide and Homicide by People with Mental Health Illness (NCISH) has published Suicide by children and young people: National Confidential Inquiry into Suicide and Homicide by People with Mental Illness. This report examines findings from a range of investigations, such as coroner inquests, into the deaths by suicide of people aged under 25 between January 2014 and December 2015 in England and Wales, extracting information about the stresses they were facing when they died.

Public Health Outcomes Framework: health equity report: focus on ethnicity

This report presents analysis and commentary on inequalities for 18 indicators from the Public Health Outcomes Framework (PHOF). PHE is using the PHOF indicators to monitor progress to reduce health inequalities in England. This report brings together recent data and provides an indication of trends where possible. It is also designed to help health and social care organisations understand inequalities for different populations and supports these organisations to address the inequalities in health outcomes.

Marmot indicators 2017

The Institute of Health Equity has published Marmot Indicators Release 2017. This briefing provides an update on progress since the 2008 Marmot Review into the most effective evidence-based strategies for reducing health inequalities in England. This update finds that improvements on life expectancy at birth and remaining life expectancy at 65 have slowed since 2010. The analysis also finds that inequalities within and between local authorities have persisted.

Winter pressure in A&E

The Department of Health has published The Government response to the House of Commons Health Select Committee Report on Winter Pressure in Accident and Emergency Departments. The report responds to each of the twenty seven conclusions and recommendations in the Health Select Committee's report. It highlights how the NHS prepares for winter, as part of its year-round operational resilience planning, to ensure the health and social care system in England is fully prepared for the increased pressures at that time of year

NHS published STP progress dashboard.

NHS England has published a baseline performance dashboard for the 44 STPs nationally. STPs have been given an overall rating based on performance across nine domains. STPs are categorised as 'outstanding', 'advanced', 'making progress' or 'needs most improvement'. Baseline ratings have been assessed against performance across nine domains and include hospital performance, patient focused change and transformation. Derbyshire is rated as advanced in this initial assessment.

In addition, NHS England have announced £325m of capital investment for 15 schemes, targeted at the strong and most advanced STPs. An allocation of £30m from this funding has been allocated to Derby Hospital who will develop an 'urgent care village' where GP services, a frailty clinic and mental health services will be co-located to ensure patients receive the right care in the right place and prevent unnecessary A and E admissions.

Leading a healthy workforce

NHS Employers has published Leading a healthy workforce: engaging board and clinical leaders to take positive action on staff wellbeing. This case study

is designed to enable board and clinical leaders to challenge their current thinking and actions on how they are supporting the wellbeing of staff within their organisation. It helps them to consider what good looks like, the difference between wellbeing in policy and wellbeing in practice and what they can do to positively influence this going forward.

The wellbeing of secondary school pupils with SEN

The Department for Education has published a report which compares the levels of happiness and psychological difficulties between children with and without special educational needs (SEN). The report highlights that children with SEN may experience their school and family life in a way that is distinct from those without SEN, for instance they are at greater risk of being bullied and being excluded or having absences from school as well as have learning difficulties or disabilities that make it harder for them to learn than most children of the same age.

Status of mind: social media and young people's mental health and wellbeing

The Royal Society for Public Health has published a report which looks at the positive and negative effects of social media on young people's mental health. The report finds that negative effects include: anxiety; depression; lack of sleep; poor body image. Positive effects include: learning about other people's experiences; self-expression; building relationships. Key recommendations include:

- Provide users with a pop-up warning when they exceed a set level of usage.
- Highlight when images of people have been digitally manipulated.
- Teach safe social media use in schools.
- Identify users who may be suffering mental health problems and discretely signpost them to support.

General practice nursing workforce action plan

England's Chief Nursing Officer has launched a ten point action plan to recognise and develop the roles that general practice nurses have which transform care and can help deliver the plan to make the NHS fit for the future. The action plan sets out the work needed to deliver more convenient access to care, more personalised care in the community and a stronger focus on prevention and population health driving better outcomes and experience for patients.
