Report of the Executive Director for Children's Services

Schools Forum Membership and role

1. Purpose of the Report

- (i) To advise the Schools Forum of changes to the membership of the Schools Forum following further conversions to academy status;
- (ii) To invite Forum members to discuss other membership-related issues and the likely work programme for 2019/20.

2. Information and Analysis

2.1 Membership update

The Schools Forums (England) Regulations 2012 (as amended) which govern the operation of the Schools Forum require that the Forum's membership is reviewed periodically to ensure that the allocation of mainstream school places between maintained schools and academies remains broadly representative of the position within each local authority. The current membership of the Schools Forum is shown in the table below.

The school places must be at least $2/3^{rds}$ of the Membership, (Derbyshire has 3/4.) In addition there are "observer" places on the Forum for LA Elected Members, the Parent Partnership and the Education and Skills Funding Agency.

Based on a review of the October 2018 pupil census and individual institutions' status as at 1st April 2019, the following revised picture emerges:

It is proposed that the above changes to the representation of schools and academies be implemented from 1 September 2019 and the Forum's Constitution amended accordingly.

2.2 Other Membership issues including future role

At the end of the last meeting of the Forum in January, Forum Members asked if the Schools Forum would be required in the future as the tenure of members had been extended on the assumption that the Forum would be dissolved in 2020-21. It was agreed that the issue would be discussed at the June meeting.

On the question of the requirement to have a Schools Forum, there has been no indication, either formally or informally, from the DfE that there will be a change in policy in the near future. The current national framework still has school forums as key advisory and decision making groups, including helping to set the local funding formulae for 2020-21. A full list of the roles and responsibilities is provided at Appendix 1.

It is correct that the current terms of office were extended until 31 August 2020 on the basis that a "hard" national funding formula was likely from April 2020. Whilst the hard national funding formula has been delayed for at least a year there are still major local issues to consider, not least those around SEND which have been the discussed earlier this evening. Financial year 2020-21 will also be the first year of the next national spending review, which will bring its own opportunities and challenges.

The Authority believes it is in the best interests of the wider school community that the accumulated collective expertise of the current Schools Forum membership be retained at this critical time for school funding. The Authority therefore proposes to retain the current membership terms: the Authority hopes that the existing members will continue to give their time, knowledge and experience to the work of the Forum over the coming months.

Some of the key issues facing the Forum over the next two terms include:

- Consideration of the options to address the high needs shortfall, including a possible LA request to transfer funds from the Schools Block:
- Further implementation of the national funding formulae:
- Consideration of the implications of the next Comprehensive Spending Review:
- Consideration of the Minimum Funding Guarantee (MFG) rate:

- Determination of central early years and Central School Services Block spend:
- Decisions on growth fund and contingencies
