What is Alternative Provision?

Alternative Provision refers to education that a student receives away from their school, arranged by local authorities or by the schools themselves.

What is the Alternative Provision Directory?

All Alternative Providers have the same duty as mainstream schools to keep students safe and comply with education guidance from the DfE.

This AP Directory is a list of providers that are available to Derbyshire school students.

Providers on the directory have offered assurance that they:

- Follow procedures for safeguarding as advised in 'Keeping Children Safe in Education' which includes annual safeguarding training
- Follow safer recruitment
- Are aware of the PREVENT Duty
- Are aware of their duty to promote British Values and Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural opportunities
- Comply with Health & Safety procedures
- Comply with Data Protection legislation
- Will employ appropriately experienced and qualified staff that are able to educate students with varied learning and behavioural needs
- Record and report student attendance
- Work to ensure equality and diversity

The Directory also includes APs that are out of county but within close traveling distance to the Derbyshire border such as Mansfield, Nottingham, Sheffield, Worksop and Stockport.

Neither the County Council nor its staff are responsible for making recommendations on the suitability of providers for use by individual schools or whether they will deliver the perceived benefits. Such evaluations must be made by school management and Governors in accordance with the School's financial procedures and legal obligations.

Derbyshire County Council take no responsibility for the monitoring of students at these providers and it is the responsibility of the referring school to check the relevant compliancy documents and that working practices are being adhered to.

When must an AP become registered as an Independent School?

Alternative Providers have a duty to be registered with the DfE if they educate one EHCP student, or 5 other students, for the majority of their timetable. Full time education is 18 hours or more per week. Providers must comply with this guidance to ensure that they are educating students legally. All registered Alternative Providers are subject to Ofsted inspections. Very few are currently registered schools. If they are found to be acting illegally, the business will be closed.

Quality of Alternative Providers

The School Inspection Handbook September 2018 p74 states that;

“Inspectors...should make every effort to telephone or meet staff in the institutions where pupils are taught offsite to help assess the school’s quality assurance arrangements. They must evaluate the rigour with which the school monitors the attendance, behaviour, learning and progress of the pupils who attend them.”

“Inspectors must visit a sample of the placements during an inspection...and should give priority to visiting unregistered providers”.

The Directory does not offer any reassurance of the quality of the teaching and learning delivered by the providers. The responsibility of the quality of the alternative provision used rests with the commissioner. Please contact the alternative providers directly to discuss commissioning, evidence of their compliancy and to discuss how you will measure their quality. “Commissioners should maintain on-going contact with the provider and students and have clear procedures in place to exchange information, monitor progress and provide pastoral support.” Alternative Provision Statutory Guidance for Local Authorities, January 2013.

Description

Baby People has 17 years of experience working with young people who face challenges in realising their potential. We employ local artists to help students improve their self-expression, confidence and skills, and to achieve qualifications in Music, Graffiti and many other subjects. We follow a social pedagogy method that enables young people to discuss and decide (with support from our tutors) the rules and methods that will best enable them to achieve. As well as running sessions at our main studios, we are able to run sessions at quieter satellite sites and in students' own settings.

Our work can expose young people, sometimes for the first time, to the arts and can inspire and support a lifelong relationship with arts and culture. We want young people to feel invited and connected to their local cultural life and venues through developing their own creativity and means of artistic expression. We aim to use many young people's existing connection to urban music and arts to engage them in exploring their own creative skills.

Baby People's flagship music production and lyric writing workshops teach basic beginner to professional level skills. A practical course that covers all aspects of music production and lyric writing alongside studio techniques and gives an insight into local music opportunities. Students can continue onto most music production or music and sound technology courses for post-16 either at Baby People or Derby College, as well as the well renowned creative sector-focussed Confetti College in Nottingham. Students will have picked up studio engineering and performance skills which would give them the experience needed for studio work, but also the confidence and social skills to cope with and express

themselves in various work environments.

In our Graffiti Art class, learners will study a range of graffiti and aerosol art techniques and look at the cultural back ground of the art. Aerosol and Graffiti Art has the ability to help young people feel invested and connected to their environment. Learners will work in a range of disciplines from paint pens and sculptures to large scale indoor and outdoor graffiti murals. No previous experience is required. Our building is currently decorated by graffiti students and continues to be designed and changed by students. Artwork portfolios and techniques will be documented as part of students Arts Award qualification which includes skill sharing by learners and viewing public art.

EMERGE is our team building and activities programme and is designed to develop physical intelligence. It uses as its basis the Belbin Model, the international Gold Standard for behaviour profiling.

The Belbin Model is a powerful tool for team building, evolving leadership and personal development. Belbin Team Roles are used to project strengths and manage weaknesses, ultimately helping students work together in effective combinations. Through this we help pupils discover their strengths and recognise and use others' strengths to their best advantage.

Key skills that we develop include Team Work, Problem Solving, Leadership, Motivation, Communication, Spatial Awareness, Confidence, Thinking Clearly Under Pressure, Resilience, Interpersonal Skills, Creativity, Strategic Thinking, Planning, Resourcefulness, Decision Making and Adaptability.

REACTIVATE is our mindset change and behaviour management programme, based at the unique setting of Chesterfield FC's Proact Stadium, and focuses on building cognitive intelligence.

It is built around the work of renowned educational psychologists such as Carol Dweck and Angela Duckworth, as well as sports psychology elements from experts like Steve Peters and Matthew Syed.

The aim of the course is to encourage and provide students with the tools to achieve their full potential. The course is a mixture of theory, physical activity and motivational guest speakers. The overall objective is re-integrate pupils back into a normal school timetable.

SAFE is our emotional support programme intended to develop emotional intelligence. Our course is based on our nationally recognised Spireites Active for Life programme which is endorsed by the Royal College of Psychiatrists. We have worked alongside CAMHS to adapt the course to be more relevant for a 14-16 age group.

The course applies the Model of Human Occupation encouraging students to develop their “will, drill and skill” in a safe and secure environment. Psycho-educational health and wellbeing topics covered include Food & Mood, Anxiety Management, Exercise, Relaxation, Body Image, Social Anxiety, Coping Strategies, Peer Support, Emotional Regulation, The Effects of Modern Technology.

Accessible and fun physical activities with the emphasis on ‘play’, including walking football, sitting volleyball, team games and more. Physical and emotional health is monitored through checks on blood pressure, weight and pupil recorded outcome measures.

Description

All our programmes have three strands:

- Personal Development

When young people come to us, they usually have issues which have been preventing them from achieving success.

So, we start there: we work with them to tackle those issues head on and to build the confidence, self-esteem and resilience they'll need to take control of their future. We take them hill walking and canoeing. We get them climbing, building shelters and 'weaselling' - navigating their way through small spaces.

We teach them 'camp craft' – how to put up a tent, build a fire and cook outdoors - and if possible we take them away on residential weekends.

We use these activities to:

- Push their personal boundaries, to inspire and challenge them to succeed.
- Develop life and priority social skills such as communication, leadership, team working, respect for others and to apply this learning to other areas of their lives.
- Education

We want all young people to have the opportunity to engage in and benefit from their education and to gain skills and qualifications that will help them access employment.

We support students who are behaviourally challenging and at risk of being, or who have been excluded from mainstream education.

We work with schools to re-motivate pupils who can't cope with formal school structures and who might

be at risk of exclusion and, ultimately, unemployment.

Many of the learners we work with are children missing from education or new arrivals to the country. We work as an integral part of the alternative provision commissioned service team supporting key stage 3 and key stage 4 learners who are experiencing difficulties, supporting them early enough to make a difference.

- Social Action

The final piece of the jigsaw for us at Endeavour is to encourage our young people to give something back through social action.

We subscribe to the 'Step up to Serve' definition of Social Action which is 'practical action in the service of others that creates positive change'. In practice, this means providing our young people with opportunities to gain new skills and experiences through activities that also directly benefit others.

Activities like clearing land and building fences for 'Beyond Boundaries' - our partner charity which supports people with learning difficulties. Or providing hands-on support for our local food bank. Or collecting and distributing coats for local homeless people. Or carrying out tasks at our local railway station to improve the environment and help users.

We can offer:

- Provision based on outdoor challenge. This is physically active, usually based in the countryside and might involve activities such as climbing, canoeing, caving, problem solving. Learning is hands-on and active but learners will reflect and review as part of sessions (experiential learning).
- Provision based on learning vocational skills. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the time will be classroom based, $\frac{3}{4}$ of the time will be practical activity, learning by doing. Learners will learn skills related to the vocational area they chose or have tasters in a range of skill areas including:
 - home improvement (including plumbing, brick laying, plastering, decorating, dry stone walling)
 - catering
 - hair and beauty
 - nails, motor vehicle
 - others by arrangement
- Bespoke packages of 1 to 5 days per week designed in partnership with referral agencies. This could be outdoor challenge based, ESOL based, vocational based, GCSE based depending on the requirements of the agency.

All learners work towards qualifications appropriate to their level and ability.

All learners will gain a portfolio of certificates demonstrating their skills and competencies through the AQA Unit Award Scheme. Learners will work towards specific vocational qualifications e.g. Level 1 Nail Technician.

Students will work in a fully equipped motor vehicle workshop, enabling practical skill development of servicing and maintaining vehicles.

Assessment will be a combination of completed worksheets and video evidence of the practical skills required

Engineering through Fabrication and Welding

The BTEC qualifications cover a variety of planned work designed to enable skill development and progression within MIG/MMA welding processes, oxy/fuel gas cutting/heating, drilling/broaching, grinding/sawing and fastening techniques.

Learners will practise taking accurate measurements of materials, promoting the development of functional skills and minimising waste material from cutting processes. This promotes the importance of a planned work scheme to prevent time and material wastage.

Through the use of skip manufacture and repair, as an engineering education medium, learners also develop an understanding of the impact and use of environmentally damaging waste products and the

role of 'self' within that cycle.

Each learner will engage in real work, taking ownership of what they produce as it is instrumental to the assessment process, producing a real saleable product, with the emphasis on quality (fabrication and weld skill development), accuracy and economics (functional skills).

All assessments are completed in house in the form of ongoing course work and practical demonstrations. On completion the student will leave with a professional portfolio of completed coursework, a DVD and industry standard witness statements.
