At the present time due to Covid-19 we are unable to deliver face to face training and are currently only delivering webinars so our programme is much reduced at the moment. We will be adding further webinars as these are created and as soon as we are given the go ahead to resume face to face delivery we will publish our full programme of training. New webinars are being added all the time and this programme will be updated regularly.
