

Guide to Submitting Applications for Carrying Out Works to Protected Trees (TPO consent) to Derbyshire County Council via the Planning Portal (see link below)


This is a short guide to explain how to submit your application for TPO consent directly to Derbyshire County Council via the Planning Portal. You should only use this method if you have already confirmed that the tree(s) in question are protected by a TPO that has been made by Derbyshire County Council. You can check this yourself by using the Derbyshire Mapping Portal.

Once you have confirmed the trees are covered by a County Council TPO, you should visit the planning portal. Before you can <u>submit applications via the Planning Portal</u>, you will need to set up a user account using the link below. You will only need to do this once.


NB: The Planning Portal is the official national online platform for submitting planning applications (including applications to carry out work to protected trees) in England and Wales. It is not designed by, operated or maintained by the County Council.

Steps:


1. After you have set up your account you should select "Start new application" under the Planning Application section.




2. Next give your application a short name (for example the address/location of the tree(s)). Click continue.




3. Enter the nearest postcode to where tree(s) are located and then select the nearest address from the drop-down list. This will tell the system which local planning authority area the trees are in. Click continue.







4. Under "Select your application type", scroll down to the bottom and select "Tree works: Trees in conservation areas/subject to TPOs".




5. Under "Select you application category", choose "Regulation 3".




Under "Select Local Planning Authority", choose "Derbyshire County Council".
(NB: you will also see an option for the relevant district/borough council for the postcode area you entered in step 3).



7. When you click continue it will take you to a summary screen, where you can edit the information you have already added. Once you are happy with the information. Click "Create application".



8. This will take you to the online form where you can follow the various steps to complete the form and upload the supporting documents that are required. (NB: if the tree(s) are on land that does not have a postal address, there is an option to provide a description of the location of the trees at the bottom of the first question - "Tree Location" under the "Complete application questions" section. (You should keep your description of the location as brief as possible, for example "land to the north of [address]"). Once the application form has been completed and all supporting documents uploaded you can click to submit your application.
