

Exhibiting at Buxton Museum and Art Gallery

Throughout the year, Buxton Museum hosts a series of temporary exhibitions of works by living artists, as well as annual exhibitions and displays of the museum's collections.

There are two temporary exhibition spaces – Gallery 1 and Gallery 2. We usually programme exhibitions for periods of between 10 and 15 weeks.

Our aim is to have an interesting programme across the year showing a range of media and a balance between emerging and established artists. We usually show exhibitions that relate to Derbyshire lives and landscapes, but don't exclusively do so.



All the applications we receive are considered together at an annual programming meeting, usually in December. We plan our exhibitions over a year ahead, so at the end of 2019 we will consider applications for 2021. Our spaces are booked through 2020.

How to apply

If you wish to be considered for an exhibition you should send the following information:

- **Some information about yourself or your group** e.g. a CV or a group history/leaflet.
- **Images of your work (5 maximum):** ideally as digital images on CD or as good quality photographic prints.
- **Exhibition proposal:** tell us about your work and where your practice is going. If you're a group, explain how your pieces will work as a whole

We treat submitted images and statements/proposals as examples of your practice so far and understand that completely new work could be produced for exhibition.

The deadline for applications is 30th November. All applicants will receive a letter or email after the programming meeting has taken place, either offering them a specific exhibition slot or informing them that their application has been unsuccessful.
