Why The Archaeological Way?

Follow The Archaeological Way and you'll be walking in the footsteps of history! You are now in an ancient landscape of Stone Age hunting camps, Romano-British settlements and medieval deer parks. Nearby you can find Elizabethan Houses and a castle-cumpleasure palace, all on the edge of Sherwood Forest. Discover the beginnings of the Industrial Revolution and the rise of the Derbyshire – Nottinghamshire coalfields. From pre-history to present day, there is lots to discover.

The Archaeological Way programme is developing an 11 mile (18.5km) multi-user trail between Pleasley Pit Country Park and Creswell Crags, providing a key missing section of the Derbyshire – Nottinghamshire trails network. Follow the AW along the route.

Exploring Greenways

The Archaeological Way is part of a larger network of trails, including the Phoenix Greenways, Clowne Greenway, Dukeries Trail and Robin Hood Way. Link the trails using public rights of way and you can spend an afternoon, a day or even a week exploring the treasures that the Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire borders have to offer.

Easy Access – Greenways are generally level and surfaced. Gradients are kept to a minimum and you'll find benches for resting.


