Tapton Lock Visitor Centre

The visitor centre is a brilliant place to visit and a great place to start exploring the Chesterfield Canal and Bluebank Pools Local Nature Reserve.

Come inside

You'll find the Visitor Centre on the ground floor of the building, furthest away from the road. We are only small but packed with information and things to do. Our friendly and informative staff have lots of ideas to help you make the most of your visit. Why not have a drink or ice cream while you browse our books and souvenirs?

Take a break outside

Bring your picnic and stay a while enjoying the peace of the canal. Watch the trip boat cruising through the lock on a Sunday afternoon or buy some duck food from the Visitor Centre.

Walking and cycling leaflets

Get your bike out or your walking boots on! We have lots of information to help you get out and about. Take yourself on a short easy walk from Tapton Lock or on a longer cycle ride along the Trans Pennine Trail. Pick up a leaflet to help you explore North East Derbyshire and all it has to offer.

Boat trips

Enjoy a trip on the Chesterfield Canal Trust boat, 'John Varley', most Sunday afternoons and Bank Holiday Mondays from Easter to October. Longer trips are also available and you can charter the boat for private parties - we can give you the contact details, just call in and ask.

Wildlife along the canal

A walk on the canal towpath can be full of surprises. You will see many different birds, including visiting grebe and the elusive kingfisher. In the colder months, look out for waxwings in the trees around the Visitor Centre. These beautiful birds, which summer in Scandinavia, often drop in to sample the berries. We've even seen grass snake basking on the towpath or cooling off in the canal on warm summer days.

Volunteering

The Visitor Centre is the base for our Rangers. If you want to get involved, why not join our volunteers. You will make new friends and learn new skills. Call in, or phone us, for more information on 01629 533020.

Events all year round

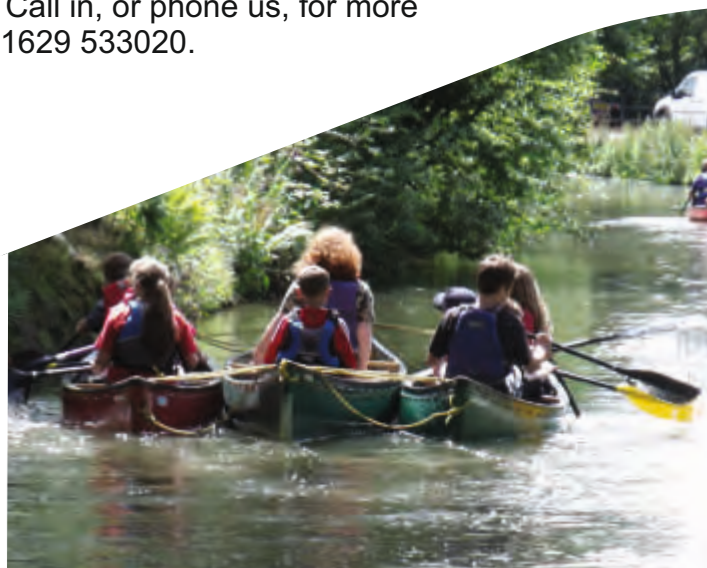
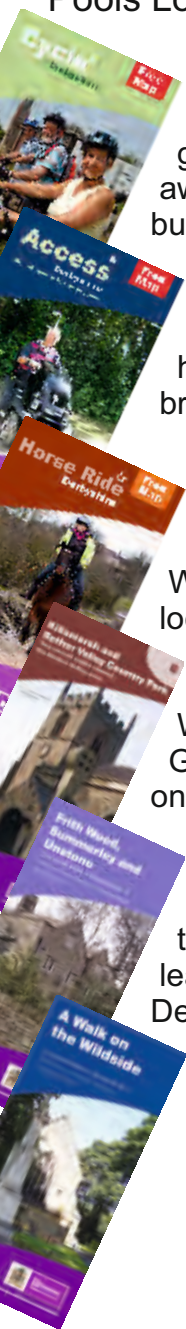
We have lots of events and walks throughout the year - from family fun activities to dawn chorus walks. Pick up an events book, look for our events board or visit our website, to see what's coming up.

Scooter for hire

If you find it hard to get around you can hire our Trampler, an all-terrain mobility scooter, then you can explore the towpath as far as Staveley. The first hour is free. You'll need to bring two forms of identification with you and also a cash deposit. You can just pop in, but it's best to call us and check availability.

If we are closed

The Audio Post, on the towpath opposite the Visitor Centre, tells the story of the Chesterfield Canal. Hear tales from a boatman and a lock keeper and discover things to do.

special and well looked after.

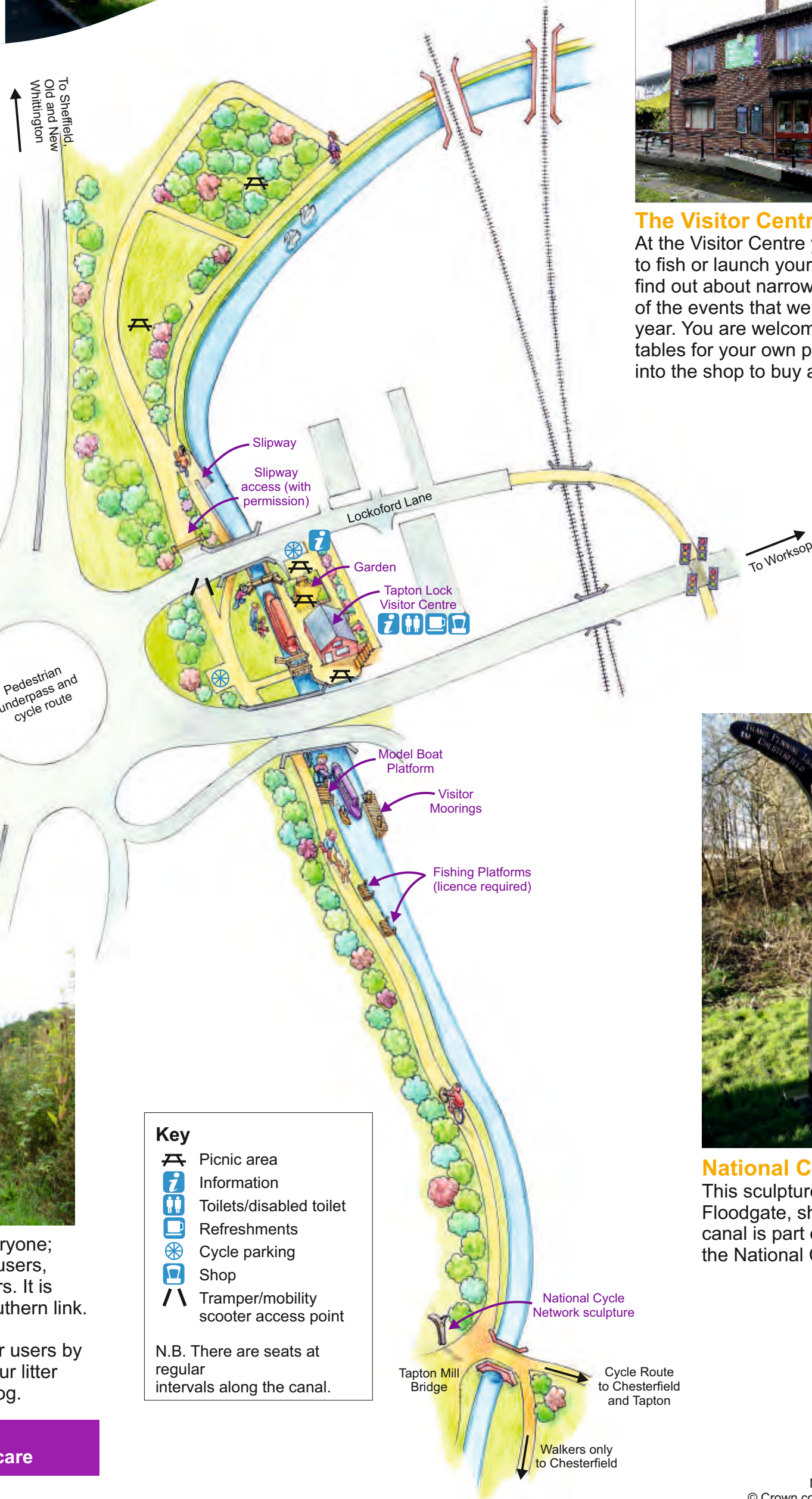


From left to right: The John Varley trip boat at Tapton Lock, artwork produced at the Tapton Festival 2013, poppies and other wildflowers grow on the canalside.

The Visitor Centre

At the Visitor Centre you can buy permits to fish or launch your own boat. You can find out about narrow boat trips and any of the events that we run throughout the year. You are welcome to use our picnic tables for your own picnic or you can call into the shop to buy a drink or ice cream.
