

Derbyshire Adult Care, working with other statutory and voluntary organisations, is committed to supporting the health and wellbeing of local people and assisting them to find the resources they need to enjoy life to the full.

We support people to:

- live independently;
- · keep well;
- stay safe;
- be active in their community;
- · avoid going into hospital unnecessarily; and

• return home promptly after a hospital stay.

We want people in Derbyshire to maintain their independence for as long as possible. Key to enabling you to make the right decisions about care and support is having access to high-quality information and advice. This Directory is one way of providing information, but we will continue to work with our partners to improve the range of information available. We also provide a range of other universal services that are available to all local people. These are detailed below.

Prevention services

Prevention services aim to offer low-level support to help people remain independent. There is a large number of services available, including:

Signposting – Derbyshire First Contact Scheme

The First Contact Signposting Scheme is a free service for adults living in Derbyshire. By filling in one simple form, you can be referred to a number of local organisations and community groups who offer services, information and advice to support your health, independence and wellbeing. These include:

- home fire safety checks;
- housing options advice;
- information about community alarms;
- support with emotional/mental wellbeing;
- · welfare rights advice;
- support to lead a healthier lifestyle, including stopping smoking, losing weight, getting more active, reducing alcohol intake and help with substance misuse:
- warm homes advice;
- information about social and recreational activities;

- referral to the home library service;
- information about local community transport;
- support for carers;
- · advice about preventing falls; and
- information about local befriending services, including Timeswap.

Volunteering

Volunteers are very important and support a huge range of activities and services that could not run without them. People choose to volunteer for all sorts of reasons, including getting more involved in their community, a desire to help other people, and to build their own confidence and learn new skills. People of all ages and backgrounds are involved with volunteering and assist in places like libraries, care homes, befriending services, sports clubs and much more.

Many people say that they find the experience of volunteering very rewarding. If you would like to volunteer we'd love to hear from you, even if you can only spare one hour a week. We are able to offer potential volunteers training which will provide them with a Volunteer Passport. Time Swap

Time Swap is a scheme that encourages local communities to help each other by sharing time and talents.

Time Swap members earn 'time' by doing things in their community to help other people. For example, Mrs Jones feels isolated as she has no family in the area. So Time Swap member, Mrs Hudson arranges to visit Mrs Jones for an hour a week for a cup of tea and a chat. By visiting, Mrs Hudson will earn an hour in 'time'. She needs a little help with her garden so she contacts her Time Swap broker and redeems her hour



earned for an hour gardening from Mr Shaw who is another Time Swap member.

Time Swap talents can be all sorts of things: basic DIY, sewing, help with paperwork/forms, dog walking, cooking, computer skills, reading, ironing – it really can be anything.

Handy Van

The Derbyshire Handy Van Service provides practical support to help older and vulnerable people to live independently in their own homes. The service is available to people over 60 and each eligible household can use the service, for free, twice a year. The service offers:

- home fire safety checks;
- falls prevention advice;
- installation of key safes;
- energy efficiency advice; and
- practical DIY tasks, such as hanging curtains or changing light bulbs.

People under 60 can access the service if they are referred by Adult Care, the Derbyshire Fire and Rescue Service, Derbyshire Police, a health professional or their local district or borough council.

Brokerage

The Brokerage Service is an office-based service and is part of Derbyshire Adult Care services.

Brokers offer support to find services or information to adults who reside within Derbyshire, but not usually Derby City, which has its own Brokerage team.

Brokers in the team can support you by identifying a range of services that may meet your individual, personalised needs and enable you to have choices and options, whether funded by the council or paid for privately.

The Brokerage Service can provide information that may help you to understand your options around who supports you.

Examples of information that could be found for you include:

- names and contact details for home care providers in your local area;
- costs of home care services;
- Care Quality Commission registration details;
- current care home vacancies within Derbyshire, along with associated costs;
- details of any specialist care providers; and
- information on local groups, clubs and activities and Trusted Traders in your area.

Welfare Rights

The Derbyshire County Council Welfare Rights Service can ensure that you are maximising your income and getting all the benefits that you are entitled to and can support you with appeals if your claim is unsuccessful. The Welfare Rights helpline number is: **01629 531531**.

Derbyshire Discretionary Fund (DDF)

This service can provide emergency financial assistance to people who find themselves in serious financial difficulty and have nowhere else to turn. The Fund provides two forms of grant payment – Exceptional Pressure Grants and Emergency Cash Payments. Eligible people will be supported to resolve their immediate financial difficulties and will

be put in touch with other support and services to prevent re-occurrence. All applications to the fund will be assessed on the basis of need, urgency and risk.

Emergency Cash Payment

This assists individuals or households when there

are insufficient resources to meet an urgent need for food, heating or travel expenses, which pose an immediate and substantial risk to a person's health and safety.

Exceptional Pressure Grant

This is given to help people:

- to establish themselves in the community following a stay in a care home;
- to remain in the community rather than enter a care home;
- ease exceptional pressure;
- who are setting up a home as part of a resettlement programme following a period during which they

have been without a settled way of life; or

 with travel expenses in certain circumstances, for example to visit someone who is ill; attend a relative's funeral or ease a domestic crisis.

Awards of Exceptional Pressure Grants vary according to the cost of the items or services for which the award is made.



Adult Care Services – where do I start?

People finding it difficult to manage independently, and their carers, need to know where they can go for information, advice and support.

This Directory is an important source of information about the wide range of services available across the county.

Initial contact

You can contact Call Derbyshire, our contact centre, on: **01629 533190** from 8.00am to 8.00pm Monday to Friday and 9.30am to 4.00pm on Saturdays. Our service is provided by staff who are specially trained to deal with adult care issues. They can provide advice, signposting and practical help to enable you to continue to live your life as independently as possible. Call Derbyshire staff can also refer you through to the Brokerage team, the Welfare Benefits

team and can arrange a social care assessment if needed.

Outside of the above times, we provide emergency county-wide social care support between 5.00pm Friday and 9.00am Monday, including public and bank holidays. Call: **01629 532600**. Calls will be recorded as part of our commitment to training, audit and quality assurance.

Assessing your needs

If required, we will assess what support you need to achieve those outcomes that are affected by your health or disability. If you are likely to have significant difficulty getting involved with the assessment process and have nobody appropriate to support you, we will offer you the support of an independent advocate.

We will work with you to help identify your strengths and resources; providing information, guidance and assistance to enable you to identify what is important 'to you' and 'for you'. We will then determine whether without Adult Care support there is or will be a

significant risk to your wellbeing. This will inform our eligibility decision.

If your needs are not eligible, we will provide information, advice and signposting to other sources of support.

The national eligibility criteria were introduced by the Care Act 2014 and ensure that a consistent approach is taken to assessment of social care need across the country. You can find more information about eligibility in Derbyshire on our website:

Personalised support

If eligible, we will determine with you whether some or all of your outcomes can be met through universally available support or whether they require funded Adult Care support. You and your carers will be invited to be involved in this process.

If some or all of your 'eligible outcomes' cannot be met without Adult Care funding, a budget will be calculated that can be used to develop your Care and Support plan. This is called an indicative budget as it an 'indication' of the amount money we think is required to meet your unmet outcomes. Once the support plan has been completed we will finalise with you the money required to deliver this. This


money is known as the personal budget and can be paid either directly to you as a Direct Payment, or managed by us on your behalf to purchase the services and support you choose or a combination of the two.

Once set up, we will regularly review with you your Care and Support plan to ensure it continues to meet your needs and the outcomes you want to achieve.







Types of service offered by Adult Care

Services to support you leaving hospital

Supporting people to leave hospital safely and quickly is a key priority for us. If you are likely to need Adult Care support following your discharge, a referral will be made to our service. An Adult Care worker will liaise closely with you, your family and health staff to work out what is best for you. The team will use all the different services that are available to help you recover your health and independence and return home as soon as is safely possible.



Reablement

This service aims to encourage your independence by helping you do things for yourself, rather than having things done for you.

You will be referred to the service if you are assessed as able to benefit from a period of reablement. Reablement can be provided for up to six weeks, in residential care, a day service, in your home or in any combination of these.

The service is also available to people who are already receiving support arranged by us, but whose needs have changed significantly, and where an assessment identifies reablement would be beneficial.

You will be actively supported and encouraged to take part as fully as possible in the design and delivery of your reablement and the service will work with you to identify outcomes that are important to you.

Outcomes could include, for example, improving self-care, domestic skills, and building self-confidence.

You will not need to pay anything towards your period of reablement as it is 'free at the point of entry'. However, if the service does not have capacity for you, it will not be available and alternative care and support arrangements will need to be made. You may need to contribute towards the cost of the alternative arrangements.

Your care needs and the level of support you require will be regularly assessed for up to six weeks. As soon as it is felt that you are as independent as you can be, the service will end. If ongoing care and support needs are identified at any point during or at the end of your reablement period, longer-term services may be arranged, the cost of which you may need to contribute towards.

Home care services

A home care service provides essential care to people in their homes, aiming to support their independence and improve their quality of life.

Following your assessment, it may be identified that a home care service would best meet your eligible needs. If so, you may choose to purchase your service from a range of home care providers, including Derbyshire County Council's own home care service, or you could employ a personal assistant or buy your care privately. A list of home care agencies in

Derbyshire begins on page 20.

All home care organisations that provide personal care must register with the Care Quality Commission (CQC), which is responsible for monitoring care services to make sure they meet the required essential quality standards. The CQC has reports on the services it inspects and also awards quality ratings.

To determine if you will need to contribute towards the cost of your non-residential care and support services, we will carry out a financial assessment. The assessment will be carried out under the terms of the co-funding policy. Co-funding is the term that Derbyshire County Council uses to describe the partnership approach we adopt to the funding of appropriate services to support you to remain at home.

Co-funding applies to most people receiving non-residential services as part of their care package (for example, care in your home) who have capital and savings of less than £50,000. We will only ask you to make a contribution from any non-means-tested benefits and allowances you receive for your care, or

where you have significant capital.

To work out what you will be asked to contribute, we need to know what income and capital you have along with details of any housing costs, such as Council Tax, rent or mortgage payments that are not already met by benefits.

If you have less than £50,000 in capital, income and savings, the maximum contribution you will be asked to pay is 75% of low rate Attendance Allowance, middle rate Disability Living Allowance (Care Component) or standard rate Personal Independence Payment (Daily Living Component) which is a maximum amount of £41.73 per week. This figure may change over the lifetime of this Directory. This applies even if you receive the higher rates. You will not be asked to contribute more than the actual cost of the services you receive.

Before we ask you to make a contribution, we will check to ensure that you are receiving all the benefits and allowances that you are entitled to. This check will include a wide range of benefits and allowances. The County Council, in line with the rules we have to follow, will always ensure that a person's income is not reduced below a minimum level after any contributions have been paid.

Support for carers

Carers make a significant contribution to the provision of care and support in Derbyshire. A carer is anyone who provides unpaid care for another person needing care, regardless of the amount or type of support they provide. Carers, including young carers and parent carers, fulfil a variety of tasks including practical household tasks, personal care and emotional support. - finding local carer support groups;
- · training and learning;
- advocacy; and
- ways in which your GP can support you.

Carers Emergency Card

The Carers Emergency Card is a free service for carers who are concerned about what would happen if they were taken ill, in an accident or if another emergency stopped them from getting to the person they care for.

The service gives peace of mind that, should something happen to prevent you from providing care, the person you care for will not be left without support.

When completing the application form, an emergency plan will be made. This is your chance to tell us what would need to be put in place to support the person you care for in the event of an emergency and anything else that you feel we need to know.

Once the emergency plan has been made, you will receive a Carers Emergency Card, which will identify you as a carer. The card contains a unique number and the contact number for Call Derbyshire. In the event of an emergency, the plan will then be shared with the person who is going to provide the back-up care.

Support for young carers

A young carer is someone aged 18 or under who helps to look after a family member who is ill, frail, has

a physical or learning disability, poor mental health or misuses substances or alcohol. Most young carers help look after one of their parents, a sibling or a grandparent.

Derbyshire Young Carers Service is provided by Derbyshire Carers Association and can offer:

- someone to listen who understands your situation;
- activities, including evening clubs and days out with other young carers;
- help with talking to important people in your life, for example school, professionals and family members; and
- additional help which can improve life at home.

Short breaks, respite and short-term care

Community Care Centres

Over the last few years, Derbyshire County Council has developed a number of Community Care Centres. These provide community hubs for the provision of specialist care for older people, including those with dementia. The purpose-built centres offer long- and short-term residential care beds,

day care and host a number of support groups and other services. Community Care Centres also provide facilities such as bistros and hair salons which can be used by the local community.

Telecare services

Telecare equipment provides peace of mind for people living in their own home by generating an automatic alert if assistance is required. Telecare can also help with managing medication, using equipment and/or recorded prompts.

Telecare services can be purchased privately or can be provided (for eligible clients) as part of an Adult Care support package where it meets particular identified needs, such as a risk of falls. To access the telecare service, a telephone line and a nearby mains socket for the control unit are required. Most sensors are wireless and battery powered, they will be provided and installed for you. When a sensor detects a problem, there is an automatic dial to a response centre where trained staff can either speak to you via the speaker on the control unit, or contact family, carers, or the emergency services.

Day services

Day services aim to support people with their personal development, independence and inclusion in local community life. There are various services, offering support for people with differing levels of needs, from those who require minimal support through to people who need more intensive personal care.

We have an accredited list of day service providers that are assessed to make sure they meet certain standards and can provide high-quality services. We monitor these providers to ensure they maintain these standards and use the list to buy services on behalf of people who are eligible for council support.

You may also approach service providers directly and purchase services if you have a Direct Payment or as a private customer if you do not have eligible social care needs.

Services provided by the NHS

Intermediate care

Intermediate care is a health-funded service that provides therapist intervention to support someone's recovery after illness or to prevent admission to hospital. To access intermediate care, a referral is usually made by your GP or other social care or health professional. Initial referrals will be assessed by a multidisciplinary team which may include occupational therapists, physiotherapists, nurses and adult care workers, who can provide short-term specialist support treatments to get you back to health.

Services are designed to maximise your independence and aim to help you stay living at

home, but can also be delivered in a care home or similar setting where appropriate.

To be eligible, you must be:

- medically stable and supported by your GP in the community; and
- able to benefit from time-limited assessment or rehabilitation, in order to improve your level of independence.

If it is considered that you are not suitable for intermediate care, you will be given the reasons for this decision. You may also be signposted to a more appropriate service if required.

NHS fully-funded Continuing Health Care

NHS Continuing Health Care (NHS CHC) is a package of continuing care arranged and funded solely by the NHS, for people with ongoing health care needs.

To establish whether you are eligible for NHS CHC, your care needs will be assessed by a health professional. If you are eligible, you can receive NHS CHC in any setting; your own home, with services from a community nurse or specialist therapist, or in a care home, whichever is most appropriate for your needs.

People who are eligible are likely to:

- have a complex medical condition that requires a lot of care and support; and
- need highly specialised nursing support.

Accommodation options

Extra Care housing

Extra Care housing gives you the security and privacy of a home of your own, but with 24-hour care and support services available if you need them. There are frequently one- and two-bedroom flats available with a range of communal facilities on-site, such as a restaurant, IT suite and an activity room. The schemes generally offer a choice of properties for rent, sale or shared ownership.

Choosing Extra Care housing means that you are living in your own accommodation and can usually remain there if your care or support needs change. The schemes aim to house people with differing levels of need so that the community is balanced. If you are being considered for Extra Care housing, you will be assessed to determine what support you need. Unless you require long-term nursing care, it could offer you a home for life. Extra Care housing is normally available to people aged 55 years or over, although it may be suitable for certain younger people with disabilities where appropriate.

Extra Care has the following benefits:

- you have your own front door, so you can decide who comes in;
- couples and friends can stay together;
- it offers a safe and secure home for people who need support, including people with learning disabilities;
- 24-hour care and support services are available, through the Wellbeing and Support service;

- · you can join in social activities if you wish; and
- residents generally have a mixture of support needs.

We are currently working with housing association partners to develop a range of Extra Care housing schemes throughout Derbyshire.

You may be asked to contribute towards the cost of the Wellbeing and Support service. All residents will have the use of the Wellbeing and Support service and the contribution will form part of your tenancy agreement. The contribution will go towards the cost of services not covered by rent, such as responding to your alarm in the event of an emergency and accessing on-site support to help you maintain your independence.

The amount you will pay will depend on your financial assessment and how much income and capital you have. The maximum you will have to pay is £13 per week, you may pay less or possibly nothing. If you have capital above £23,250 you will be asked to contribute the maximum contribution.

Sheltered housing

Sheltered housing is suitable for older people who wish to live independently but want the reassurance of knowing that assistance is available if there is an emergency. There are many different types of sheltered schemes, available both to rent and to buy. Schemes usually consist of between 15 and 40 dwellings. These may be bed-sit rooms, self-contained flats, or bungalows.

Some schemes are simply housing designed to meet the needs of older people and linked to a community alarm. Some schemes have access to a floating support worker for those who need it as well as a community alarm service. There may be some communal facilities such as a lounge, laundry, guest flat and garden. Meals are not normally provided.

Sheltered housing for rent is provided by local district/borough councils or housing associations. If you are interested in being considered for accommodation of this kind, you need to register with your local district/borough council, who have information about all the social housing vacancies in your area. Specialist care

There is a wide range of services provided in Derbyshire to meet the needs of specific client groups, such as people with a learning disability, physical disability, or mental health condition. Most people who need a service will come through Call Derbyshire or will be referred to us by another organisation. We will look in detail at the support needs that you have and will work with you to identify the options for meeting these.

If you are eligible for funded Adult Care assistance, a support plan will be drawn up to identify the outcomes you wish to achieve and a personal budget will be provided to meet these. You may decide to buy your own support from Derbyshire County Council or from an independent sector provider.

Residential care

Care homes cater for people who can no longer manage in independent accommodation.

Derbyshire County Council provides a number of care homes directly. Others, including a number with nursing beds, are provided in the independent sector. Details of the homes available are listed in this Directory starting on page 49.

Care homes

A care home is a home which provides accommodation with full board and personal care. Normally you would have your own bedroom, which may or may not be en-suite, and staff would be available on-site 24-hours a day. A 'sheltered' or 'warden assisted' housing scheme would not be considered as a care home as the options of full board and personal care are not provided for an 'all-in' charge. Some homes are able to provide specialist services for people with a learning disability, dementia, mental health condition or for younger disabled people.

Care homes providing nursing care

The difference between a home providing personal care and a home providing nursing care is that the latter provides care where there is a need for the involvement of a qualified nurse. Care homes with nursing have to be staffed 24-hours a day by trained nurses.

The homes featured in this Directory are either owned by Derbyshire County Council, private sector proprietors, or voluntary sector organisations. All care homes are regulated by the Care Quality Commission (CQC) and are inspected to ensure they reach an approved standard.

We currently operate a local scheme to reinforce quality standards in care homes and home care agencies. Each organisation has been given the opportunity to apply to become a Quality Premium Provider and those who have qualified have demonstrated that they have met standards in staff training and competence, for which an additional payment is then made by us.

People choosing a home are advised to ask if the home is a Quality Premium Provider.

Dementia Premium

In 2015, we introduced an award and additional payment for care homes providing dementia care to people who are funded by the council. Care homes located in Derbyshire that provide dementia care to someone with a formal diagnosis of dementia can apply for this. The home must undergo an assessment by the council to ensure the dementia care provision is to an acceptable standard based on nationally recognised outcomes. People choosing dementia care in a home are advised to ask if the home has made, or is considering, an application for this award. For fees information, see page 43.

Care homes for those with dementia

When considering a care home for someone with dementia, it is particularly important that it offers a person-centred service that can be tailored to meet individual needs and provides support to maintain and improve quality of life. Some homes can offer an environment which has been designed specifically for people with dementia and can aid orientation.

People with dementia can also benefit from group or individual therapies involving social interaction and mental stimulation. Activity co-ordinators and occupational therapists can offer reminiscence, music therapy and other creative therapies.

Many care homes can offer places to someone with

dementia. You should discuss your requirements with individual care home managers and ask about specific dementia training for staff.

Good quality end of life care

Although the subject of dying is often painful to contemplate, it is essential that you and your relatives discuss your wishes as you near the end of your life. Good planning for all your needs should mean that you can (if you choose) remain in your home in your last days and not have to be admitted to hospital.

When choosing a service, you should consider its end of life care philosophy and policies. Enabling people to die in comfort and with dignity is a core part of providing care and the way care professionals approach the process will be incredibly important for you, your family and carers.

The service should have an open approach to end of life care. It should initiate conversation with you and your family and work with your GP to ensure your needs and wishes are discussed and planned for. An end of life care plan should also be drawn up, as it is vital to establish your preferences and choices.

You could use the Preferred Priorities for Care (PPC) document to help with outlining your wishes. The PPC document is designed to help you prepare for the future and gives you an opportunity to think about, talk about and write down your preferences and priorities for care at the end of life. The document can be found at: www.endoflifecareforadults.nhs.uk

It is also important to know that all health and social

care staff must be trained in communication regarding end of life care and will be trained in assessing the needs of individuals and carers.

It is worth asking care providers whether they are working towards The Gold Standards Framework. This can be used in various settings, for example hospitals, primary care and care homes, to improve the coordination and communication between different organisations involved in providing care for someone near the end of their life.

Essential information

Inspecting and regulating care services

All care providers must be registered under a system which brings adult social care, independent healthcare and the NHS under a single set of essential standards of quality and safety.

The Care Quality Commission (CQC) registers, inspects and reviews all adult social care and healthcare services in England in the public, private and voluntary sectors. This includes care homes, care homes with nursing, home care agencies and NHS services, amongst others.

Inspectors carry out a mixture of announced and unannounced inspections looking at the quality and safety of the care provided. They look at whether the service is: Safe, Effective, Caring, Responsive to people's needs, and Well-led.

Inspection teams are led by an experienced CQC manager and often include experts in their field. The team may also include professional or clinical staff; Experts by Experience; people who use services;

and carers.

Following an inspection, each care home and home care agency is given a report of how it rates against national essential standards of quality and safety. The CQC has also started rating services as: Outstanding, Good, Requires Improvement and Inadequate.

When considering a care service, it's always a good idea to check its inspection report and rating on the CQC's comprehensive website: **www.cqc.org.uk** or ask the care provider you are considering for a copy of their latest inspection report.

Safeguarding adults

In Derbyshire, we aim to do whatever we can to protect someone from abuse. We work with local people and organisations, including providers of care to ensure they alert the local authority if a person is experiencing harm or abuse, or is felt to be at risk of experiencing harm or abuse.

The Care Act 2014 states that local authorities have a duty to assist all adults over 18 who:

- have needs for care and support (whether or not the local authority is meeting any of those needs); and
- are experiencing, or are at risk of, abuse or neglect;
 and
- as a result of those care and support needs, are unable to protect themselves from abuse or neglect.

What can you expect from us?

If you want to talk to someone regarding any abuse you or someone else is experiencing, you can

contact Call Derbyshire on: **01629 533190**. You will be referred to an adult care worker and asked in confidence about the details of the abuse and what outcomes you want from the disclosure.

Your views will be respected and, if you need a representative to speak on your behalf, this will be welcomed.

However, if it is felt that you or others are at high risk, the local authority may have to share this information with a third party, for example a GP or the police.

If you are concerned that the person who is being abused is not able to understand the abuse or the risks, the local authority can look for an advocate who may be able to represent the adult.

The person who is being abused, their representative or advocate will be included throughout the contact and supported to achieve

the best outcomes for them.

Help is available for all adults at risk of abuse, including those who arrange and pay for their own care. If you wish to talk this through further please contact Call Derbyshire and they will put you in touch with an adult care worker to discuss your concerns.

Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards (DOLS)

Some people in care homes and hospitals lack the mental capacity to make key decisions, such as where they live and what support they need. It may be necessary to restrict their liberty for their own safety. For example, it may be too dangerous for a person to go outside alone. Their privacy may need to be restricted by frequent checks by carers. In law, these restrictions may constitute a deprivation of liberty.

The Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards (DOLS) is a legal process that helps ensure that such restrictions are only used if they are necessary, proportionate and in the person's best interests. Care homes and hospitals have a duty to alert the local authority if they need to deprive someone of their liberty.

Referrals are prioritised, particularly for people who object to their care, and people who experience the most significant restrictions. Two independent professionals assess the person. They consider if support could be provided in a less restrictive way such as in the person's own home, or if the likelihood and seriousness of harm would make this impossible.

Their assessments are scrutinised by a manager within the local authority before a person's deprivation of liberty may be authorised legally.

Comments, compliments and complaints

All organisations need to know how they are performing. They are happy to receive your feedback on their service whether they are compliments or complaints. Feel free to tell them what you think and your comments can be used constructively to improve the service.

If you do need to make a complaint, you should feel able to complain about any aspect of your care that affects your happiness or comfort. This could be about the way you are treated by a staff member or the quality of the food you are served. You can also make comments and suggestions about possible improvements to your surroundings and the services provided.

Making a complaint should not be difficult for you. Providers are required under national standards to have a simple and easy to use complaints procedure that they will be happy to give you. If you are concerned about the care that you, a friend or a relative is receiving, it is normally best to speak to the manager before you take any further action. The problem may be resolved quite easily once they are made aware of it.

However, if you need to make a formal complaint, you should initially contact the registered owners of the service. They have a duty to respond to any complaints made. If your complaint is about a breach of regulations, you can contact the Care Quality Commission.

If you have a complaint about the services that Derbyshire County Council provides, we have a simple procedure to help you when things go wrong. We are committed to providing high quality, personalised and respectful support that is designed

If you have been unable to resolve your complaint you can contact the Local Government Ombudsman on: **0300 061 0614** and ask them to assist you. The Local Government Ombudsman looks at complaints about councils and some other authorities and organisations, including adult social care providers (such as care homes and home care providers). It is a free service. Its job is to investigate complaints in a fair and independent way.

How solicitors can help

A solicitor can give you impartial advice about wills, making gifts, estate planning and Powers of Attorney. Some can also offer guidance on immediate and long-term care plans, ensuring (if applicable) the NHS has made the correct contribution to your fees.

Whether you remain in your own home or move into sheltered or residential care, you may qualify for financial assistance in the form of social care and NHS-funded care and welfare benefits.

If you are self-funding your care and have a contract

with your care provider, it is important to speak to solicitors with experience in this field. Any contract should explain the cost of care, what services are included in the price and how often this is reviewed; what complaints procedure is in place; what your rights are and the obligations of the care provider under the contract; the procedure for cancelling a contract and the administering of medication.

The Citizen's Advice Bureau offers an advice service and will be able to recommend solicitors in your area. See page 47 for contact details.

Your search can be sent to you by post or email, or discussed with you over the telephone. If you are searching online, the results can be saved and emailed to others. Derbyshire Care Providers Association (formerly the Derbyshire Care Homes Association)

This publication provides you with a lot of information regarding care homes and their services within the county. The Derbyshire Care Providers Association (DCPA) represents the independent sector and supports care providers to enable them to improve the quality of life for residents in care homes.

The DCPA managing committee meets regularly throughout the year and also meets with local authorities, councillors, MPs, NHS and the regulators, the Care Quality Commission, to lobby and consult on behalf of care providers and their residents.

The vast majority of care providers offer an excellent caring service carrying out their work quietly in an effective way promoting choice, dignity, privacy and independence in an individualised manner. Bad news is however nearly always reported by the media. Good news and good practice are rarely mentioned

even though that is the norm.

It is common for people moving into a care home to rediscover what life has to offer, make new friends and to start enjoying life again. The help that a person receives in a care home will be planned to meet their specific needs in such a way that privacy, dignity, independence and individuality are recognised and maintained at the highest level.

As well as having rights within the home, there is also a legal right to choose which care home you wish to live in. If you receive funding support from the local authority to pay for care home fees, you may need a relative or friend to pay a 'top-up' charge to the care home on top of what the local authority contributes.

The Derbyshire Home Care Association

The Derbyshire Home Care Association (DHCA) is the official body for all independent providers of 'Care at Home' in Derbyshire. Membership is open to all home care providers who are registered with the Care Quality Commission (CQC) and who are on Derbyshire County Council's approved list.

The Association meets regularly and its committee also meets with the director and senior managers of the County Council's Adult Care Services, to discuss policies, procedures and fees.

The objectives of the Association are to:

- promote the quality and standards of care in the home care sector in Derbyshire through shared knowledge and awareness;
- provide a forum for exchange of information on topics of common interest;
- advise members of changes in policy or of a political nature which will impact on domiciliary care; and
- consult and liaise with Adult Care Services regarding matters which concern the membership.

The Association holds meetings regularly, to which

all members are invited. It regularly has guest speakers who cover



a range of topics, including training provision, quality standards, CQC, and changes in registration, inspection and legislation.

Because of the importance of the role that the DHCA plays, the Association feels that it is important that all agencies share its voice, and it is keen to encourage membership from all home care agencies in Derbyshire.

Paying for residential care

Short-term care/respite

The amount a person will have to contribute towards these services will depend on the length of stay. From April 2017, the standard rate is £134.45 per week if you are over pension age, or £80.75 per week if you are under pension age or £65.55 per week if you are under 25 years of age. Your charge will be calculated based on the number of nights you stay in the care home. If your stay exceeds three weeks, or you wish to extend your stay for over three weeks you will need to have a financial assessment. If the home you choose charges more than we would

expect to pay to meet your assessed needs then a third party top-up payment would apply in addition to the standard fee.

These charges apply to anyone who has capital or savings of less than £23,250. If you have more than this amount, then you will have to pay for respite or short-term care charges in full as you would be considered self-funding. However, you are still entitled to an assessment of your needs and assistance with choosing the most appropriate support.

Financial assessments

For any period of care exceeding three weeks, we will complete a financial assessment to calculate how much you will need to contribute towards the cost of your support. During the assessment, we will consider your capital assets, savings and income.

If you have capital and savings of less than £14,250, you will be asked to contribute from your income and the local authority will meet the shortfall, subject to an assessment of your needs to determine our maximum contribution.

If you have capital and savings between £14,250 and £23,250, you will contribute towards the cost of your care from your income, savings and capital. Your contribution from your savings and capital is calculated on a sliding scale whereby you pay £1 for each £250 you have between the lower and upper figures.

The value of your home is included in the assessment as part of your capital if you are moving into residential care, unless your spouse, partner or a qualifying dependent remains in the property after you have moved into care. The value of any additional property is included in the assessment. If you choose not to have a financial assessment, you will be responsible for paying the full cost of your care and support.

If your capital and savings amount to more than £23,250, or your income is higher than the cost of

your care, you will have to pay the full cost yourself. However, you are still entitled to an assessment of your needs by Adult Care.

These figures may change during the lifetime of this Directory.

If you are eligible for support from the council and you are moving into a care home or care home with nursing, we will give you a choice of homes that charge the amount we would usually pay for someone with your needs. If the home you choose charges a fee in excess of what we would expect to pay to meet your needs, you will have to find someone to meet the additional amount (explained further in the section on third party payments).

Attendance Allowance, Disability Living Allowance and Personal Independence Payments

These are non-means-tested, non-taxable benefits from the Department for Work and Pensions. There are different rates depending on the level of your needs. Everyone who needs care should consider claiming these benefits. However, they will not be paid if you are, or become, a permanent resident in a care home unless you are meeting the whole cost of your care. If you are not responsible for the full cost of your care, payments will usually stop after you have been in permanent residential care for more than four weeks.

If you are entitled to the mobility component of Disability Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payment, this payment will not stop once you are in a care home and is not included in your financial assessment.

NHS Funded Nursing Care Contribution

Whether you are a temporary or permanent resident, if you live in a care home that provides nursing care, you may be entitled to a non-means tested NHS Funded Nursing Care Contribution (FNC), currently £155.05 per week, towards the cost of your nursing care. This is paid directly to the home and is used as part payment towards the overall fee.

NHS fully-funded Continuing Health Care

If you are eligible for NHS Continuing Health Care (CHC), you can receive the services you need in any setting, including your own home or in a care home. The NHS will pay if you need healthcare from a community nurse or a therapist as well as personal care to help you at home. For more information, see page 28.

Whatever your circumstances:

- your assessment will be made up of two elements, care and finances;
- if your partner still lives at home, they will not be means-tested in relation to your fees. If you have a private pension, you may pass on 50% to your partner at home and only half will be considered when you are assessed. However, you will need to consider the effect this would have on any benefit claims your partner makes after you move into care,



as it may reduce their entitlement to other financial help; and

• a nursing home will generally be more expensive than a residential home which offers personal care only.

Remember to seek benefits advice and consider claiming:

- Universal Credit (if you are under pension age);
- Pension Credit (if you are over pension age);
- Attendance Allowance (if you are over 65); or
- Personal Independence Payment (if you are under 65).

Running out of money

If you are already paying for your own care and your capital is likely to reduce to £23,250 through payment of care home fees, you must let us know well in advance. We must undertake an assessment of your circumstances before deciding if we will make a contribution towards the cost of your care.

If you have been self-funding your care, and the home you are living in charges more than we might expect to pay to meet your needs, you must find someone to help pay the difference. This is known as a 'top-up' or 'third party payment' which is explained on page 43. If funds for a top-up are not available, you may need to find alternative accommodation which can meet your needs at the price we would expect to pay for your care.

Understanding your rights and options before moving into care is essential. There are several financial products and specialist companies that may be able to help. It is important to seek independent financial and legal advice before committing yourself. See page 44 for more information.

Support for full cost clients

Twelve-week property disregard

If your former home is included in your financial assessment but your other capital and savings are less than £23,250, and your income is not enough to meet your care home fees, we will contribute towards the cost during the first twelve weeks of permanent care, provided we agree that care is needed.

Deferred Payment Agreements

Subject to eligibility criteria, after the twelve-week property disregard period, you may be offered a Deferred Payment Agreement. This agreement allows you to delay selling your former home during your lifetime. Any fees loaned under the agreement will be

charged against the value of your home and must be repaid once the house is sold or from your estate. Interest is payable throughout the period of the loan and there is also a one-off fee to join the scheme. This fee covers all legal and administrative costs for the lifetime of the loan.

We may limit the amount of the loan, depending on the equity in your property but if there is enough equity you may also be able to defer the payment of any top-up as well. If you qualify for a Deferred Payment Agreement you may retain an amount of money from your income up to £144 per week. Under the terms of a Deferred Payment Agreement you can also choose to rent out your home to generate income, which will help to reduce the amount you need to borrow, and subsequently pay back to the council. If you own your home, either in full or part, please read our leaflet: 'Deferred Payments'.

Local authority contribution towards care in private sector care homes

We appreciate that the current financial climate in the care sector is challenging. It is recognised that considerable pressure exists, both for those who purchase and those who provide care home placements.

Where we can assist with funding support for an individual, the fee rates that we might expect for certain types of care are listed on page 43. Complex or variable needs are assessed individually and can attract additional funding.

Fees charged by some homes may be higher than we can pay for reasons other than complex or variable needs. It is important to appreciate that independent sector care homes are able to decide how much they charge for accommodation and care.

Funding arrangements can be complex so please seek advice via Call Derbyshire in addition to independent financial and legal advice. See page 44 for more information.

Whilst we can offer help in negotiating a fee on



your behalf, the care home can decide to change its charges from time to time, such as if you decide to move rooms or if you sell your house and become a self-funding resident. If you are concerned about any potential future changes in the amount you may have to pay, particularly in relation to top-up fees, you should discuss this with your care worker at the earliest opportunity.

Third party payments

If the home you choose costs more than we will pay to meet your assessed needs, you will need to ask someone else to pay the difference between what we will pay and the amount the home charges. This additional payment is known as a top-up or third party payment and can be made by a family member, friend or charity.

Before anyone agrees to make additional payments on your behalf, they should be aware that the amount could increase and they need to be confident that they can maintain the payments for as long as they are required.

The person paying the top-up will be asked to sign an agreement to formalise the arrangement. If the payments stop being paid for any reason, the payee must seek help and advice from us as soon as possible. The law says that you are not allowed to make this additional payment yourself, except in very limited circumstances. If you are eligible for a Deferred Payment Agreement against the value of your property and there is sufficient equity, then you may also be able to defer your top-up until the sale of your house is completed.



Seeking financial advice

Planning for your future care and support needs can be complicated and funding can be expensive. Taking professional advice may be helpful in enabling you (and your family) to identify the most suitable and costeffective solution.

There are a number of organisations that will provide free general advice about the funding of care and support. These are a good place to start if you are looking for information and want to see what sort of options are available.

There are an increasing number of excellent websites that provide information to help you make the best financial decisions in your circumstances. Some provide resources such as care cost calculators and give you the opportunity to ask specific questions.
