   	<p>Welcome and apologies</p> <p>Liam and Sue welcomed everyone to the meeting</p> <p>Kevin and Gretta read the dos and don'ts</p> <p>Minutes of the last meeting</p> <p>The minutes were approved with the following comments -</p> <p>Page 3. Dawn read out a letter from Ash Green acknowledging the letter sent to them by the North Board about access to the hydro</p> <p>Page 3. Dawn has spoken to DCC commissioners about the concerns about catering at Golding Grange. Vicki Cauldwell did an unplanned visit to Golding Grange and was happy with how they were storing packed lunches. She also said that it was not in the centre's contract that they had to provide hot food. Vicki is continuing to look into whether the consultation about the change to cold meals was done in the right way. Jackie Fleeman was worried about packed lunches being less healthy than hot meals and also whether a packed lunch could be made safe for somebody who might choke or breathe in food</p> <p>Jayne could not see how the new meals fitted the Choice and Control</p>	<p>See letter attached</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ there'll be more technology—an app for everything ◆ Too much technology would be bad. You cannot beat human contact, and loneliness is a big problem ◆ Technology could give a client more independence which will lighten the load for carers ◆ There will be more carers and vulnerable people because people are living longer and with more complex health problems ◆ Care staff might do more e-learning which is not the same as face to face training ◆ MP Toby Perkins said that needs will continue to grow. Government policies might leave less money for social care which will affect quality of life. There might be less paid carers after Brexit meaning more and more will be expected of unpaid carers. Politicians need to know what impact that cuts will have ◆ Jayne has been employed by DCC for 34 years. She would like to see policies to give more rights to staff who have caring responsibilities in a similar way to how workers have rights to time off if they have children
