What is a Direct Payment?



- A direct payment is money from Derbyshire County Council to buy care and support you need
- Direct payments are a way of having more choice and control over your day-to-day life through flexible care
- You choose the kind of support that is right for you



Who can have a direct payment?

Most people who have help from Adult Care, can have a Direct Payment



If you can't have a Direct Payment, we will tell you why



What can a direct payment be spent on?



- support to get out and about



- meeting friends



- joining in with activities or day services



- support to go shopping



- going to work, volunteering or learning



- support to do exercise



- support with cooking and cleaning



- support with personal things, like getting dressed



- pay an agency to find support for you



- pay for a Personal Assistant to support you



- pay for equipment if it is agreed in your Care and Support Plan



What can't a Direct Payment be spent on?



- pay household bills



- pay for housing



- pay for Health Services



- paying a member of your family who lives with you to provide care. You can only do this if Adult Care says it is okay



Why Choose Direct Payments?

- You're the boss! They give you choice and control and can be more flexible than the services the council can provide
- Having a Direct Payment doesn't affect any benefits you get



How do I get a direct payment?

- If you already have a service from Adult Care, contact your worker
- If you don't have a service from Adult Care you will need an assessment
