


Figure 7-12: Baslow proposed interventions

It will also provide a safer crossing for those accessing St Anne's CofE Primary School, which may attract more to use active travel to access the school.
	H2: Provide an improved side road crossing at the junction between School Lane and Over Road, this will provide more continuity along School Lane.
