

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

THE DERBYSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL AND DERBY CITY COUNCIL (SOUTH DERBYSHIRE GROWTH ZONE ENABLING INFRASTRUCTURE) (CLASSIFIED ROAD) (SIDE ROADS) ORDER 2025

The Derbyshire County Council (the "Council") hereby gives notice that it has made, and is about to submit to the Secretary of State for Transport for confirmation, an Order made under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and (to the extent that the Order relates to land and new rights in the City of Derby) under an agreement with Derby City Council under section 8 of that Act, authorising the Council to:

- (a) improve highways (including raising, lowering or otherwise altering),
- (b) stop up highways,
- (c) construct new highways,
- (d) stop up private means of access to premises,
- (e) provide new means of access to said premises,


all on or in the vicinity of the route of the classified road which the Council is proposing to construct/improve from a point 149 metres south of the centre of the A50 Derby Southern Bypass where it crosses over Deep Dale Lane, north-eastwards for a distance of 1.6km to connect to Pioneer Way.

Copies of the Order and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 11 December 2025 at the Council's offices at County Hall, Matlock, Derbyshire DE4 3AG or at Swadlincote Library, Civic Way, Swadlincote, Derbyshire DE11 0AD, or may be inspected online at www.derbyshire.gov.uk/sdgz.

ANY PERSON may not later 30th January 2026 object to the confirmation of the Order by notice to the Secretary of State for Transport c/o National Transport Casework Team, PO Box 1393, Newcastle Upon Tyne NE99 5FQ or by email to nationalcasework@dft.gov.uk stating the title of the Order, the grounds of objection and the objector's address and interest in the land.

In submitting an objection, it should be noted that your personal data and correspondence will be passed by the Secretary of State to the Council to enable your objection to be considered. Where the Order becomes the subject of Public Inquiry procedures, all correspondence is copied to the Inspector conducting the Inquiry and will be kept in the Public Inquiry library, where it is publicly available. If you do not wish your personal data to be forwarded, please state your reasons when submitting your objection and the Secretary of State will copy your representations, with your name and address removed, to the Council and if there is to be a Public Inquiry they will be seen by the Inspector who may give them less weight as a result.
